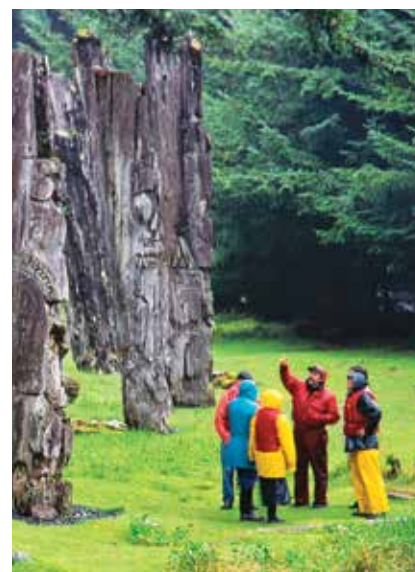

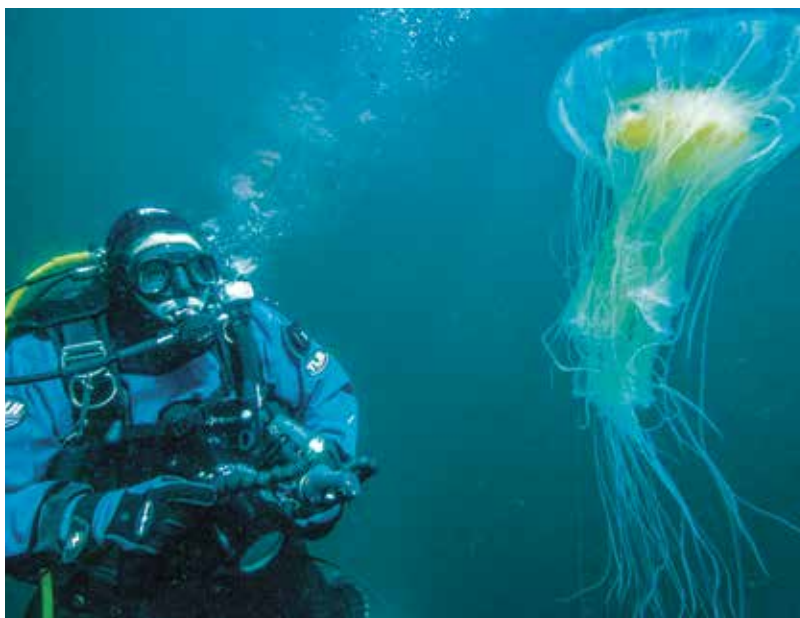
THE EXHILARATION OF DISCOVERY WITHOUT THE THREAT OF HYPOTHERMIA

BECAUSE THE UNDERSEA IS VITAL TO YOUR UNDERSTANDING of Alaska, we've committed the technology and personnel resources to offer what no other travel company in Alaska does—an exploration of the vivid and surprising world beneath our ship. During the voyage, an undersea specialist will don special cold-water diving gear to explore and shoot video of Alaska's surprising marine environment. You'll get to see this amazing world on TV screens in the warm comfort of the lounge, with an undersea specialist as your guide. You'll see the vast kelp forests and discover strange and surprisingly colorful anemones, jellies, rockfish, octopus, and other unusual life forms that are only found deep beneath the surface.



Tools for Exploration Travel

In addition to a fleet of expedition landing craft, kayaks and stand-up paddleboards, our Alaska ships are outfitted with hydrophones to listen to whales and sea lions underwater and a crow's nest camera that offers a bird's eye view of the ship and its surroundings, streamed live to the ship's lounge.

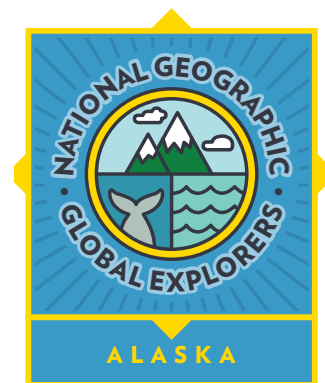

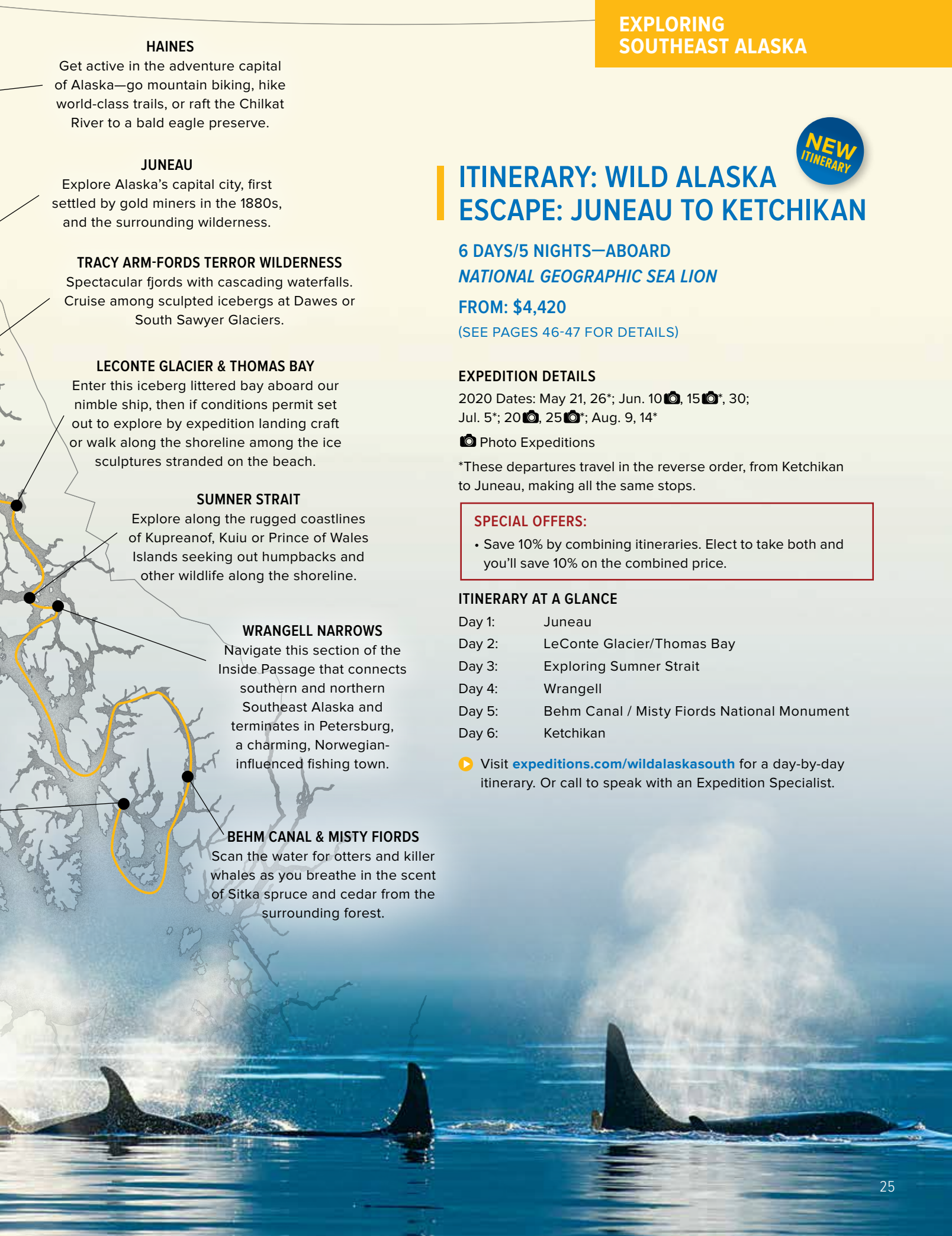

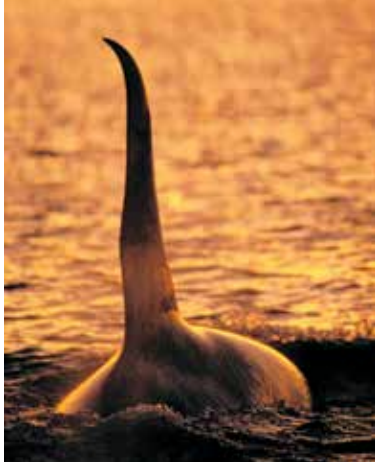

LINGER ALONG A SELDOM-SEEN COAST
ON A SWEEPING INSIDE PASSAGE ROUTE





PART OF THE LONGEST COASTLINE IN THE WORLD, THE Pacific stretch from Washington's San Juan Islands north, to Southeast Alaska's Glacier Bay National Park, navigates through several geographies, ecosystems, and notable landmarks. Following this route, our expedition balances cultural facets of the ancient and modern—First Nations performances in Alert Bay and the charming capital city of Victoria, British Columbia—with hikes through temperate rainforests in the Tongass National Forest; massive, blue-tinted glaciers; picturesque, island-dotted waterways; and myriad opportunities to spot brown bears, whales, seabirds and more.

GLACIER BAY NATIONAL PARK
Listen as the wilderness silence is broken by the thunder of the region's enormous glaciers calving ice into the sea.

INIAN ISLANDS
Hop in a Zodiac and keep watch for the abundance of Steller sea lions that reside in this island cluster.

ICY STRAIT
With special permission from the US Forest Service, hike the nearby islands with a naturalist and kayak the wildlife-rich water, searching for whales.

SITKA
Meet eagles at the Raptor Rehabilitation Center and admire the picturesque spire of Saint Michael's Russian Orthodox Cathedral.

TRACY ARM
Voyage into Tracy Arm, a spectacular fjord featuring waterfalls that cascade from the sharply sloping walls, and see just how blue the South Sawyer Glacier is up close.

FREDERICK SOUND
Observe feeding humpback whales that visit this channel for its herring-filled waters.

PETERSBURG
Stroll this charming, 100-year-old town—supported largely by fishing—and note the evident Norwegian influences.

MISTY FIORDS NATIONAL MONUMENT
Kayak the waters of this protected region, breathing in the deep-forest scents of Sitka spruce and cedar and reveling in the stillness.

SAN JUAN ISLANDS
Watch for killer whales as you Zodiac cruise the waters of this archipelago where the whales live all year round.

VICTORIA
Enjoy private gardens and art galleries, waterfront strolls and fine cuisine in this Canadian capital city.

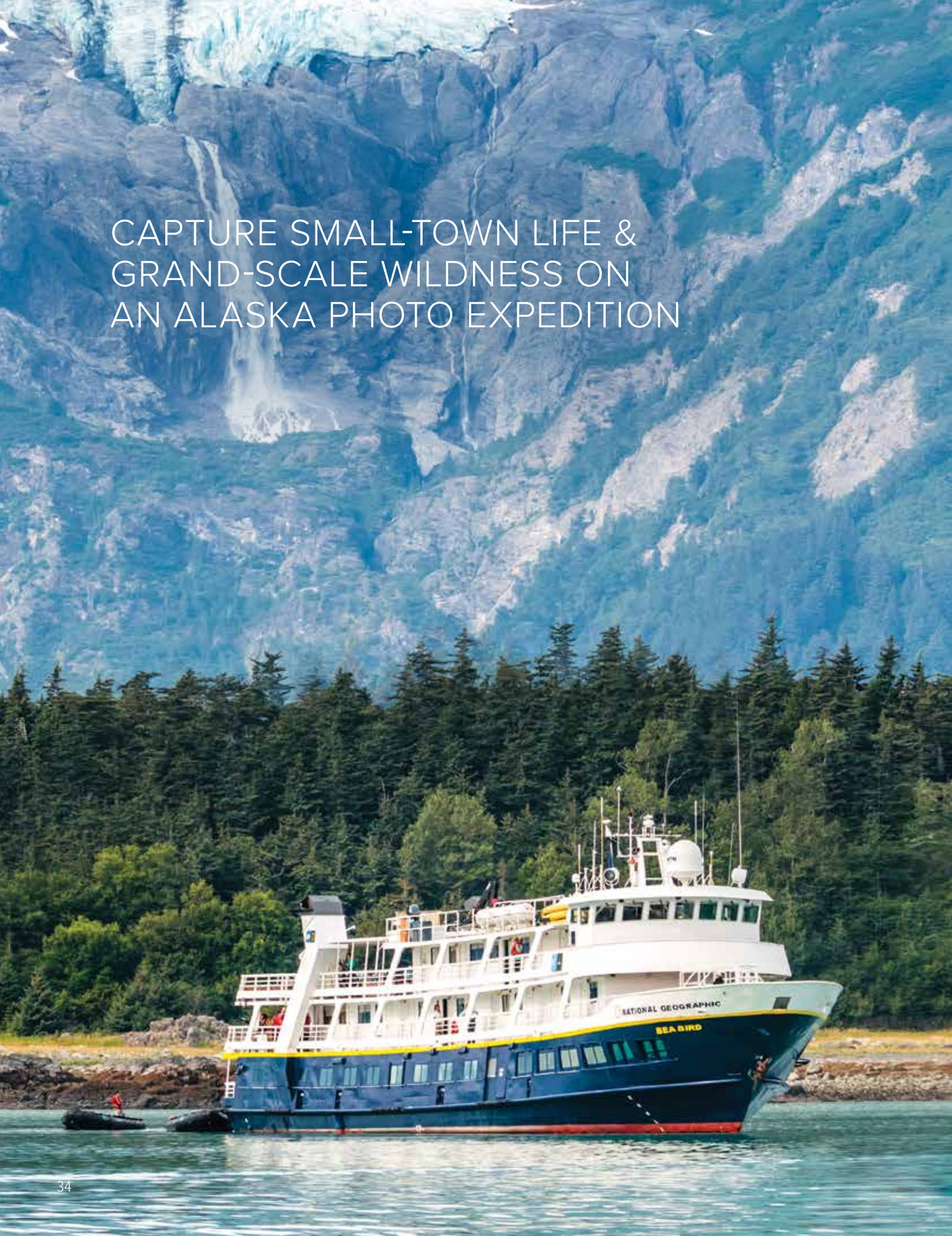

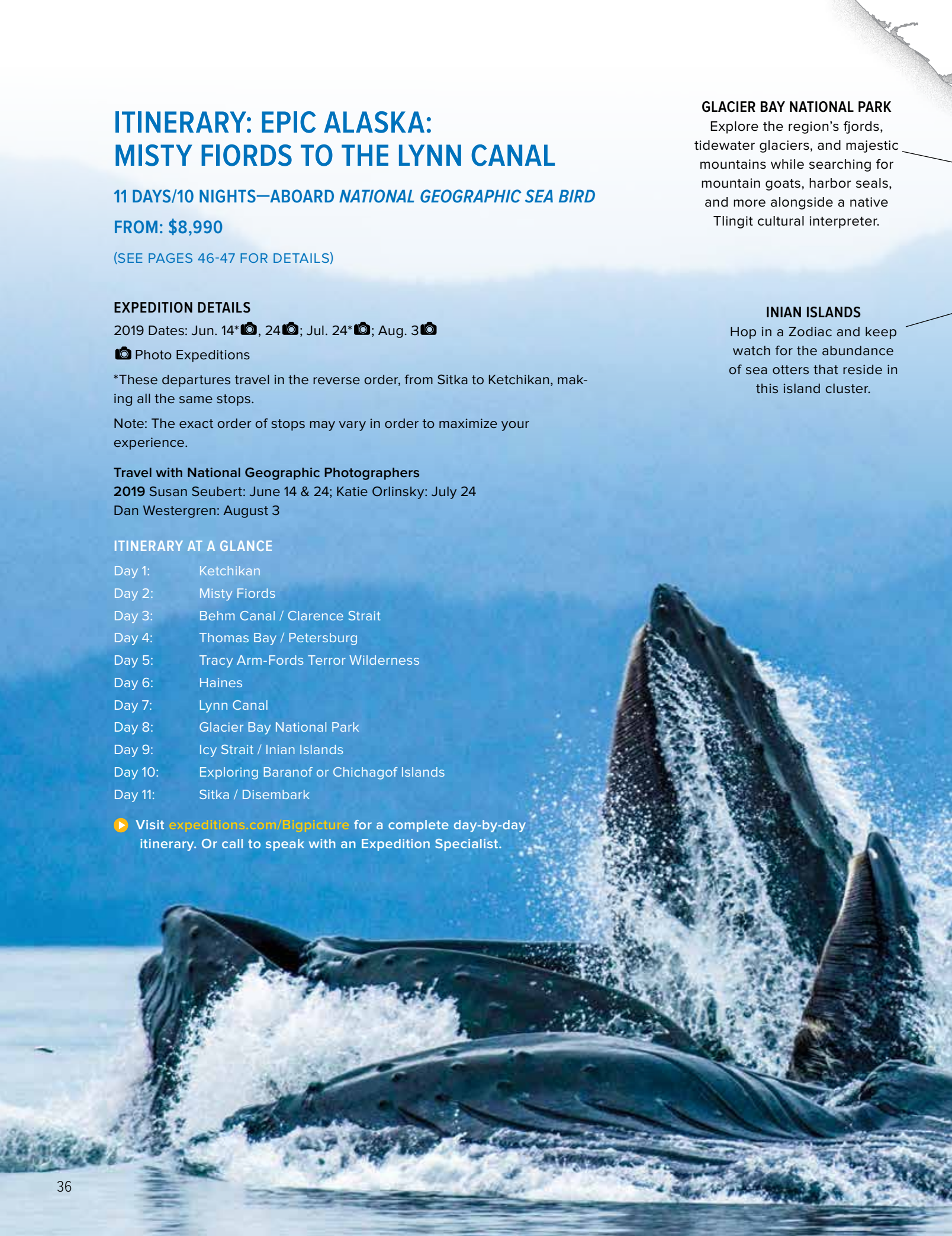

GLACIER BAY NATIONAL PARK

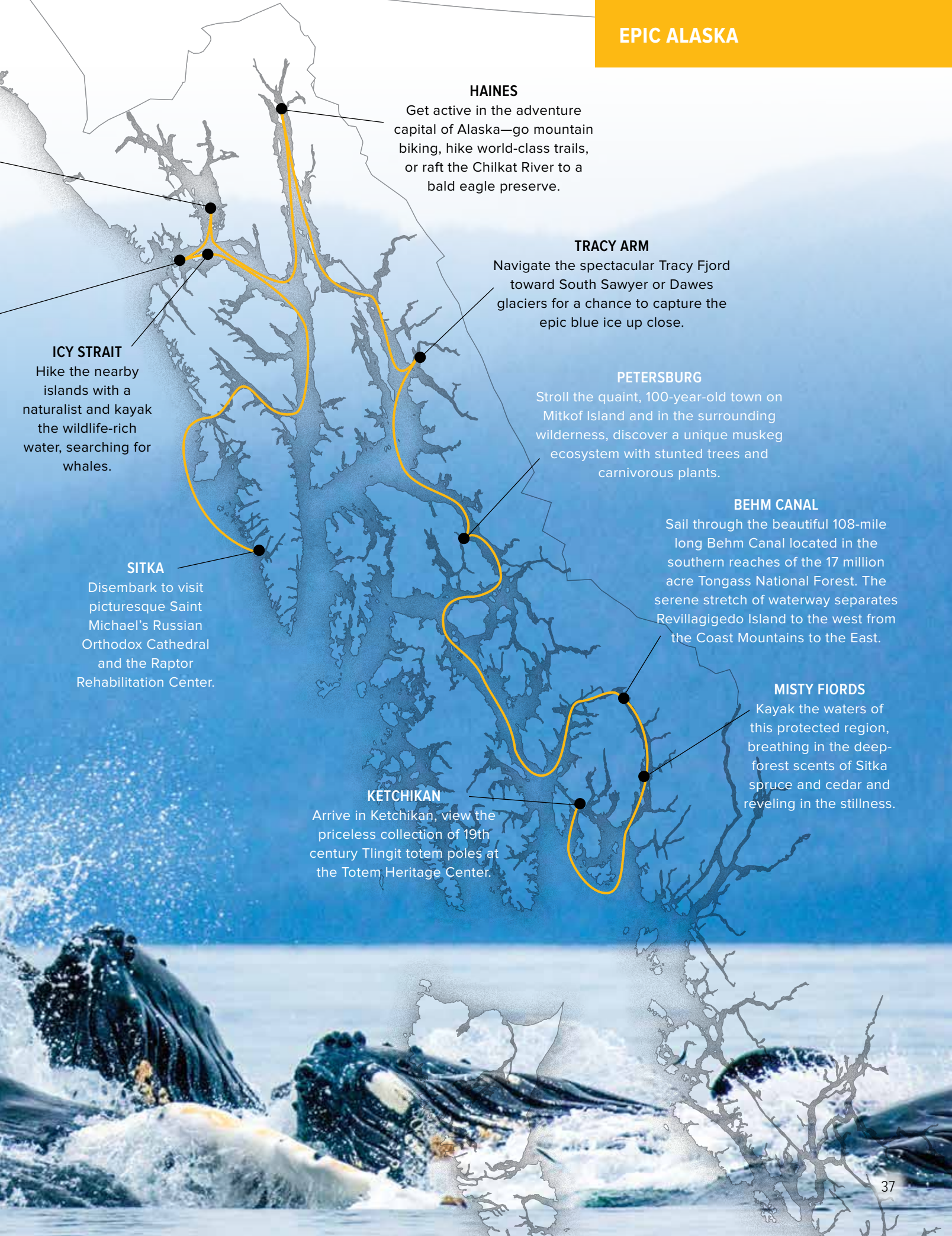

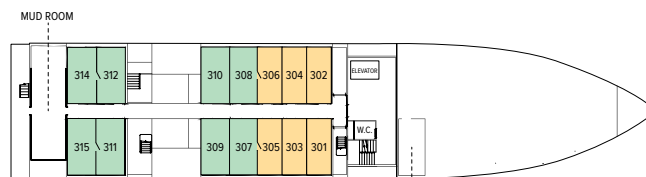

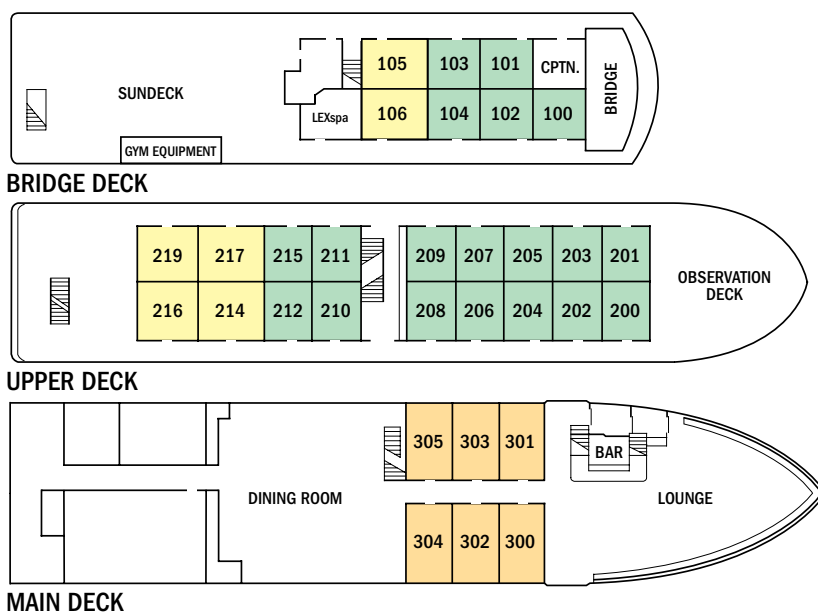

The state-of-the-art *National Geographic Orion* is a fully stabilized, ice-class vessel with an ice reinforced hull.

National Geographic Orion is at home navigating polar ice, as well as island harbors in the South Pacific.

PUBLIC AREAS: Outdoor café, lounge with bar and state-of-the-art facilities, restaurant, sundeck, reception desk, observation lounge and library, global gallery, and marina platform.
