# PRISTINE COASTLINE, ISLES OF SELDOM-SEEN WILDLIFE, AND A PANOPLY OF SEA LIFE

probably aren't the first things that pop into most people's minds when they hear about Baja. Overshadowed by the well-known nightlife of Cabo San Lucas, it is a region of untamed wildness hiding in plain sight. Wildness surrounds us as our ships ply the rich waters of the Sea of Cortez and the whale nursery bays of the Pacific. Almost inconceivably, the region is home to over a third of all marine mammal species in the world.

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# DISCOVER THE POWER AND PURITY OF WILDNESS IN BAJA

#### IN THE SEA OF CORTEZ MASSIVE PODS OF LEAPING

dolphins roil the sea's surface in a spectacle of biomass. Mobula rays swirl just beneath our Zodiacs, launching themselves into the air in a dazzling display. As we don snorkeling gear and climb into the water, sea lions leap off rocks to perform undersea acrobatics around us. Making landfall on desert isles, we hike through forests of giant cacti on sun-drenched hillsides and venture into desert arroyos that hold water long after storms, giving way to rivers of desert blossoms. Visit island sanctuaries for breeding seabirds covered with nests, filled with a symphony of bird calls so loud your naturalist needs to shout to be heard. On the Pacific side of the peninsula hike, leap, and slide down wind- and wave-sculpted dunes that stretch along the coast. And be among the privileged few to enter the birthing lagoons of the California gray whales for life-affirming close encounters with gentle mothers and curious calves.

**66** This morning we awoke just north of the islands of Los Islotes. Among the rocks that jut out from the water, we find the local cabal of California sea lions, brown pelicans, blue-footed boobies, various cormorants, and even peregrine falcons. At Isla San Francisco, we went hiking, kayaking, stand-up paddleboarding, snorkeling, and swimming off this beautiful island. As the sun set, we prepped for a Baja-style BBQ on the beach. Faces alight from the orange and red glow off the horizon, we ate, drank, and laughed about what will remain an unforgettable journey in an unforgettable land."

ocean breezes, and create front row seats on the remarkable spectacle of marine life in Baja, our nimble expedition ships are uniquely suited to make the most of being in this remote, soulsatisfying geography. All are equipped with fleets of Zodiacs, kayaks, and stand-up paddleboards to explore the desert island shores and beneath the calm sea, vivid with life. The 50-cabin National Geographic Venture is outfitted with the amenities and ability to cover great distances—reflected in their farther-ranging itineraries—while still using its small scale to sail among the islands and channels where we've been finding whales for nearly 40 years. And the 31-cabin National Geographic Sea Lion offers an immediacy and intimacy with the landscapes—reflected in the Baja itineraries for which she is perfectly adapted. She is the only expedition ship operating in Baja small enough to slip past the shifting sandbars and anchor inside Magdalena Bay, a nursery for gray whale mothers and calves, to give those aboard the experience of waking up and drifting off to sleep to the sounds of nearby gray whales.







# SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA TO BAJA

WATCH THE METROPOLIS OF L.A. FADE AWAY AS YOU SAIL south on *National Geographic Venture*, one of the newest ships in our fleet, on an expedition into the origins of California and the nation. Venture first to the Channel Islands, a gem of the National Parks system, to hike a river of pine cones to one of only two groves of Torrey Pines on Earth. Sail into the Baja Peninsula's wine region, with some areas originally planted by the Spanish in the 16th century. In the Guadalupe Valley, grapes grow in the arid climate with thick skins, producing a deep color and full-bodied, robust taste you'll sample over lunch at a private vineyard. See other evidence of Spanish colonialism while strolling cobblestone streets to plazas laid out centuries ago.

While the cultural experiences are deeply rewarding, the region's spectacular nature is the main draw. Explore the desert and islands lush with amazingly adapted plants and creatures—setting foot on the shores is akin to a walk in the "land of the lost." Searching among the 20 whale species known to cruise these waters including humpbacks and huge blues, our flexible itinerary allows us to "brake" for whales and to spend time among these gentle cetaceans. In Cabo Pulmo, you'll don snorkeling gear to explore the thriving life on the only hard coral reef in North America—a brilliant example of marine conservation. Last season, our visit to the Vizcaino Biosphere Reserve, with its world-renowned fishing cooperatives and resident elephant seals was a surprise highlight.

Enjoy daily morning stretch classes on deck and wellness treatments in *National Geographic Venture*'s spa, too. Count on an extraordinary experience—your entire expedition team is committed to doing whatever it takes.

#### DAY 1: LOS ANGELES/EMBARK

Arrive in Los Angeles, where you'll embark the *National Geographic Venture*. (D)

Home to diverse, endemic flora and fauna, birds, and 11 land mammal species, there is plenty to see in Channel Islands National Park. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 3: ENSENADA AND THE VALLE DE GUADALUPE, MEXICO

Vineyards and culinary marvels await in one of the world's hottest up-and-coming wine regions. See what the hype is all about as we visit a family-run vineyard for a private tour, tasting, and lunch. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 4: SAN QUINTÍN EXPLORATION

A day exploring in the Bahía de San Quintín and surrounding islands—home to 400+ species of plants, animals, and birds, including 23 seabird species. (B,L,D)

#### DAYS 5 & 6: EXPLORING THE

VIZCAINO BIOSPHERE RESERVE As we continue our journey along the Baja coast, we explore the nutrient-rich waters surrounding Vizcaino Peninsula. Whether encountering the resident northern elephant seals of Islas San Benito or learning about the story of the fishing co-ops of Isla Natividad and their shift towards sustainable fishing practices in the region, this seldom-visited section of Baja offers a bounty of opportunities



for exploring. We may opt to visit Guerrero Negro to the north, check on the wildlife which call Isla Cedros home, or navigate our way around the tip of the peninsula to remote bays opening to the southwest. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 7: AT SEA

As we travel south along the Pacific coast of the peninsula, there is a chance of seeing a wide variety of marine life, including the largest animal on Earth, the blue whale. Hear naturalist talks, and learn photography tips and tricks during this day at sea. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 8: BAHÍA MAGDALENA

Explore the ever-shifting sand dunes of Isla Magdalena, on a cross-island walk to one of the most pristine beaches in the Pacific. Birders take note: these fertile shorelines are home to over 40 species of birds. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 9: LOS CABOS AND

GORDA BANKS

Cruise past Friars Rocks and visit the historic





town center of San José del Cabo before cruising Gorda Banks seamount or La Fortuna, renowned gathering places for whales, dolphins, and other marine life. (B,L,D)

#### DAYS 10 & 11: CABO PULMO/ LOS ISLOTES

Snorkel the pristine reefs of Cabo Pulmo National Park and chat with locals about their advocacy to protect this unique place. With luck, swim with curious sea lions at Los Islotes before relaxing ashore. Swim, kayak, or hike on a nearby uninhabited island and end the day with a beach barbeque, bonfire, and star-filled sky. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 12: LA PAZ/DISEMBARK/

SAN JOSÉ DEL CABO/U.S. Disembark in La Paz and transfer to Los Cabos airport for flights home. (B)

# Exploring the Sea of Cortez: A Living Sea & Desert Isles

The isolated isles in the Sea of Cortez isles are commonly referred to as the "Galápagos of Mexico" because of their unique and endemic species. Roam freely among these diverse islands and bays, relying on our decades of experience to read the wind, waves, and wildlife habits to go where encounters are best. You won't see the gray whales on this voyage, but you will see plenty of other marine life, as the Sea of Cortez teems with it.

### Baja California: A Remarkable Journey

Over nearly two weeks experience the full spectrum of opportunity in Baja on both the Pacific side among the gray whales and over an in-depth exploration of the Sea of Cortez. Get up close to wild whales, see acrobatic dolphins galore, and explore the undersea. Witness great seabird colonies and hike beautiful desert islands. And capture it all with help from a certified photo instructor.

eeing gray whales in their natural habitat is one of the great delights of this voyage, as you venture out in small boats among these magnificent creatures. In the Sea of Cortez, search for a variety of whales, plus dolphins, blue-footed boobies, pelicans, cormorants, and magnificent frigatebirds. You'll also snorkel among sea lions, join naturalists on hikes amid iconic cardon cactus and sculpted sand dunes, and see a variety of desert flora and fauna.

## **EXPEDITION HIGHLIGHTS**

#### LA PAZ FIESTA

You're invited to a lively celebration of Baja culture—a guest favorite in 2020. End a day of exploration by dining on specialties from a renowned chef, hearing local musicians, and taking in an enchanting dance performance in the shadow of a historic cathedral.

## **AMONG THE GREAT WHALES**

#### DAY 1: U.S./LORETO, MEXICO/ SAN CARLOS/EMBARK

Upon arrival in Loreto, transfer to San Carlos and embark our ship. Tonight, we'll anchor off the coast of Isla Santa Margarita. (D)

#### DAY 2: BAHÍA ALMEJAS/REHUSA CHANNEL/ISLA MAGDALENA

Awake in Bahia Almejas, the southernmost part of the Bay. We'll observe a large frigatebird colony en route to the spectacular whale grounds of Bahía Almejas. Whales here tend to be very active, seemingly oblivious to our presence, so settle in for some great experiences. Later we'll reposition to Isla Magdalena to explore the ever-shifting sand dunes on a cross-island walk to one of the most pristine beaches in the Pacific. Bird-watching can be excellent here. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 3: BOCA DE SOLEDAD

Each winter, gray whales travel south from their Arctic feeding grounds to breed, give birth, and raise their calves in these sheltered waters. Today, we transfer by motorcoach to this northern extension of Bahía Magdalena where we will spend the full day interacting with these majestic creatures. Together with savvy local Mexican fishermen, we'll venture out in local pangas to view the numerous mother-calf pairs. We will likely encounter a variety of shorebirds feeding voraciously on the shoreline while frigatebirds and pelicans soar overhead. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 4: BAHÍA MAGDALENA & CRUISING

Kickstart your day with a morning stretch hosted by our onboard wellness specialist on the sun deck. After breakfast, if conditions permit, we'll explore the mangrove system via kayak, stand-up paddleboard, and Zodiac, and learn how these ecosystems support their surroundings. This afternoon, we'll sail out through "La Entrada" as we leave Magdalena Bay behind. Traveling south along the coast of the peninsula, there is a chance of seeing a wide variety of marine life, including humpback whales. Hear naturalist talks and learn photography basics. (B,L,D)



DAY 5: GORDA BANKS/CABO PULMO Awake to a majestic sunrise over the iconic Friars Rocks at Land's End. We'll spend the rest of the morning searching the seas of Gorda Banks seamount, a renowned gathering place for whales, dolphins, and other sea life. Later we'll set out to snorkel the pristine reefs of Cabo Pulmo National Marine Park, one of the most successful national marine parks in the world, and chat with locals about their advocacy to protect this unique place. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 6: LOS ISLOTES AND LA PAZ

Awake this morning off the rocky island of Los Islotes, where we'll don flippers, a mask, and snorkel and swim with curious sea lions. Then we'll reposition to the colorful city of La Paz to garner insight into the culture of Mexico, soak in the vibrant street art, and stroll the lively "Malecon." Dinner will be an unforgettable cultural experience, featuring local cuisine, dancing, and folklore. (B,L,D)





#### DAY 7: EXPLORING THE SEA OF CORTEZ

Our plan is flexible as we explore some of the Sea's many uninhabited islands. We may go ashore at Isla San Francisco, where a sweeping arc of white sand beach beckons you to kayak or stand-up paddleboard. Or, hike to the nearby ridge for unparalleled views over Isla Danzante with your naturalist. You may also visit the abandoned salt works on Isla Carmen. You'll get a chance to see the great wildlife diversity offered in the Sea of Cortez, and with some luck, blue or fin whales. (B,L,D)

#### DAY 8: LORETO/DISEMBARK/U.S.

Disembark in Loreto after breakfast and transfer to the city center. Visit the first mission in Baja California and the nearby museum to learn more about what makes this town so special. Enjoy free time to explore the quaint shops and vibrant side streets. After lunch, transfer to Loreto Airport for flights home. (B,L)

he pristine desert islands dotting the Sea of Cortez are places of incredible biodiversity set amid a UNESCO World Heritage Marine Site dubbed "the world's aquarium" by Jacques Cousteau. Each of these islands is a world unto itself, with a palpable feel of rugged isolation. Hike among forests of cacti and along desert *arroyos* in bloom as you search for endemic flora and fauna. Watch for swirling plunge-diving brown pelicans, blue-footed and brown boobies, and the frenetic aerial activity of gulls and terns that often alerts us to large pods of acrobatic dolphins. With a flexible itinerary, decades of experience, and deep knowledge of wildlife habits, this unique journey combines the beauty and biodiversity of this legendary region with a stimulating sense of adventure.

# **EXPLORING THE SEA OF CORTEZ**

### DAY 1: U.S./LORETO, MEXICO/ EMBARK

Arrive in Loreto and embark our ship. (D)

#### DAYS 2-7: EXPLORING THE SEA OF CORTEZ

Our routing is designed with flexibility in mind, to maximize opportunities for wildlife sightings. It will most likely include the islands and activities listed below, although the order may vary. (B,L,D)

#### ISLAS SAN ESTEBAN AND SAN PEDRO MÁRTIR:

Walk up a desert wash, to search for desert songbirds such as the handsome blackthroated sparrow, listen for the cascading song of the canyon wren and search for the endemic pinto chuckwalla—a plump, harmless desert lizard. Later visit Isla San Pedro Mártir, a 1,000-foot-high guano-covered island that is home to thousands of seabirds: brown pelicans, magnificent frigatebirds, Brandt's cormorants; and California sea lions.

#### **ISLA SAN MARCOS:**

At Isla San Marcos, there is a beautiful shoreline for swimming, snorkeling, and kayaking. In the afternoon, we are again in rich waters. We are on the lookout for pods of dolphins—with common and bottlenose being the most frequently encountered species. With luck they will join us as we go, riding the bow wave and sometimes leaping from the water.

#### **ISLA SAN JOSÉ:**

One of the larger islands in the Sea of Cortez, San José, offers several landing possibilities depending on conditions and the whim of the moment. Photograph the ochre cliffs of the island's eastern shore, hike an "enchanted," cactus-laden *arroyo*, or visit the abandoned salt works to the west.



#### **BAHÍA LORETO MARINE PARK:**

This morning we'll search the waters south of Isla Carmen for fin whales, which researchers have recently concluded may be a resident population. Bottlenose and common dolphins are frequently encountered. Later we visit an island of Bahía Loreto Marine Park, with ample time for kayaking, snorkeling, stand-up paddleboarding, and possibly hiking. In the evening, enjoy a beach barbecue under the desert sky.

#### DAY 1: U.S./LORETO, MEXICO/ SAN CARLOS/EMBARK Upon arrival in Loreto, transfer to San Carlos and embark our ship. (D)

#### DAY 2: BAHÍA MAGDALENA

Explore the ever-shifting sand dunes of Isla Magdalena, on a cross-island walk to one of the most pristine beaches in the Pacific. Birdwatching in this area can be excellent. We may observe pelicans and cormorants skimming the waters of the bay, or terns wheeling and darting as frigatebirds ride the thermals above, looking for an easy meal. Along the beaches, resident great blue herons feed on these fertile shorelines next to migratory shorebirds, including whimbrels and willets, as they refuel for their northbound journeys. (B,L,D)



Laguna San Ignacio is a large bay and favored haunt of the gray whales in Baja. The ship will anchor at the mouth of this remote and important locale, while we observe the mother and calf pairs in local pangas. For some reason, the whales here seem to be friendlier than they are elsewhere. It's not unusual for mothers and calves to approach our boats, the calves often playing hide and seek—sometimes even welcoming a touch or a friendly chin scratch. (B,L,D)

DAYS 3 & 4: LAGUNA SAN IGNACIO

#### DAY 5: AT SEA

As we travel south along the Pacific coast of the peninsula, there is a chance of seeing a wide variety of marine life. (B,L,D)

#### DAYS 6-14: ISLANDS OF THE SEA OF CORTEZ

Cruise past the spectacular Friars Rocks at Land's End. For those who wish, we will arrange a visit to the historic town center of San José del Cabo. Isla San Pedro Mártir, Los Islotes, Isla San Francisco—these are some of the melodious names of islands scattered throughout this beautiful sea. Upon arrival in Loreto, transfer to San Carlos and embark *National Geographic Sea Lion*. Tonight we'll anchor off the coast of Isla Santa Margarita. (D)

#### DAY 2: BAHÍA ALMEJAS/REHUSA CHANNEL/ISLA MAGDALENA

Awake in Bahía Almejas, the southernmost part of the Bay. We'll make a special stop to view a large frigatebird colony on Isla Santa Margarita before heading out on our first whale watching trip of the voyage. 




