WHEN MOST PEOPLE THINK OF BAJA, THEY THINK OF THE

California grays which migrate yearly to the calving lagoons on the west side of the peninsula, with which we experience joyful encounters. But in our nearly 40 years exploring the Sea of Cortez, our teams have reported astonishing variety, too, including pygmy sperm and false killer whales; the largest and second largest of the whales—blue whales and fin whales; plus Bryde's and sperm whales, and thousands of common, bottlenose, and spinner dolphins.

On Baja's desert isles, giant cardon cacti beckon like emphatic greeters, urging us to explore their exotic landscape. There are dozens of different cacti here; each is a fortress, with crenate ribs and ranks of star-bursting spines to guard the most precious desert commodity—moisture. And yet, in early spring, they show their softer side—the rare colors, gorgeous shapes, and scents of cactus flowers.

Our Baja team reveals the wildlife, unravels the desert's vast biological mysteries for you, and guides you over and under the surface to experience the wonders of this pristine nexus where the desert meets the sea.



66 This morning we awoke just north of the islands of Los Islotes. Among the rocks that jut out from the water, we find the local cabal of California sea lions, brown pelicans, blue-footed boobies, various cormorants, and even peregrine falcons. At Isla San Francisco, we went hiking, kayaking, stand-up paddleboarding, snorkeling, and swimming off this beautiful island. As the sun set, we prepped for a Baja-style BBQ on the beach. Faces alight from the orange and red glow off the horizon, we ate, drank, and laughed about what will remain an unforgettable journey in an unforgettable land."



EXPERIENCE BAJA IN FULL: LOVELY LORETO & LIVELY LA PAZ*

THE BAJA PENINSULA, STRETCHING 775 MILES INTO THE PACIFIC,

has more coastline than its northern neighbor. Exploring it is a form of time travel, revealing an earlier California, before development backed sovereign wildness into a corner.

And, if towering cacti are the citizens of Baja's desert isles, the quintessential towns we visit introduce us to the Peninsula's citizenry and human history. Most of our expeditions now either begin or end in the charming town of Loreto, spectacularly sited, backed by the Sierra de la Giganta mountain range. Downtown Loreto contains the Loreto Mission, the first mission in Baja California. The Jesuits were active here in the late 17th century/early 18th century. And the simple, lovely Loreto Museum, containing a collection of artifacts from the Spanish colonial period, illuminates the region's history.

The lively port town of La Paz invites you to follow your curiosity—into the discoveries that strolling an intriguing town with a maze of quaint streets always yields. By day the promenade is sun-struck and beach vibe-y, the perfect place to wander among the acclaimed public sculptures and eco-travelers heading to the Sea of Cortez, Cabo Pulmo, and more, aboard yachts and day boats. By night, the promenade glows with lights, strolling couples and families, vendors selling all manner of souvenirs and curiosities, from crafts to vivid and entertaining velvet Elvis paintings. You'll have the chance here to experience the city's highlight—fresh Mexican ice cream—among the chief pleasures that exploring Baja affords.





DEC. 12: LOS ANGELES/EMBARK

Arrive in Los Angeles, where you'll embark the *National Geographic Venture*. (D)

DEC. 13: CHANNEL ISLANDS NATIONAL PARK

Home to diverse, endemic flora and fauna; with more than 600 plant species, 140 birds and 11 land mammal species, there is plenty to see in Channel Islands National Park. (B,L,D)

DEC. 14: ENSENADA AND THE VALLE DE GUADALUPE

Vineyards and culinary marvels await as we explore one of the world's hottest up-and-coming wine regions, the Valle de Guadalupe. See what the hype is all about as we visit a family-run vineyard for a private tour, tasting, and lunch. (B,L,D)

DEC. 19: BAHÍA MAGDALENA

Explore the ever-shifting sand dunes of Isla Magdalena, on a cross-island walk to one of the most pristine beaches in the Pacific. Birders take note: It's not unusual to see as many as forty species of birds in a single day along these fertile shorelines. (B,L,D)

eeing gray whales in their natural habitat is one of the great delights of this voyage, as you venture out in small boats among these magnificent creatures. In the Sea of Cortez, search for a variety of whales, plus dolphins, blue-footed boobies, pelicans, cormorants, and magnificent frigatebirds. You'll also snorkel among sea lions, join naturalists on hikes amid barrel cacti and sculpted sand dunes, and see a variety of desert flora and fauna.

DAY 1: LORETO/SAN CARLOS/EMBARK Upon arrival in Loreto, transfer to San Carlos and embark *National Geographic Venture*. Tonight, we'll anchor off the coast of Isla Santa Margarita. (D)

DAY 2: BAHÍA ALMEJAS/ REHUSA CHANNEL/ISLA MAGDALENA

Awake anchored in Bahia Almejas, the southernmost part of the Bay. We'll stop at a large frigatebird colony enroute to the spectacular whale grounds of Bahía Almejas. Whales in this part of the bay tend to be very active, seemingly oblivious to our presence so settle in for some great experiences. During lunch, the ship will reposition to Isla Magdalena where we'll head to shore to explore the ever-shifting sand dunes, on a cross-island walk to one of the most pristine beaches in the Pacific. Bird watching here can be excellent, it's not unusual to see forty species of birds in just one day along these fertile shorelines. (B,L,D)

DAY 3: BOCA DE SOLEDAD

Each winter, during their long migration, gray whales travel south from their Arctic feeding grounds to breed and give birth and raise their calves in these sheltered waters. We'll transfer to López Mateos and spend the full day observing, and with luck, interacting with these majestic creatures. Together with savvy local Mexican fishermen we've known for years, we'll venture out in Zodiacs to view the numerous mother-calf pairs that thrive in this sheltering region. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant before heading back to the ship in late afternoon (BLD)

DAY 4: THE HULL CANAL & CRUISING Kickstart your morning with morning stretch hosted by our onboard wellness specialist on the sun deck. After breakfast, we'll explore the vast mangrove system via kayak, stand-up paddleboard, and Zodiac, and learn how these massive ecosystems support their surroundings. This afternoon, we'll sail out through "La Entrada" as we leave Magdalena Bay behind. Traveling south along the coast of the peninsula, there is a chance of seeing a wide variety of marine life, including the largest animal on Earth, the blue whale. Hear naturalist talks and learn photography basics. (B,L,D)

DAY 5: GORDA BANKS/CABO PULMO

Ease into the day with a majestic sunrise over the iconic Friars Rocks at Land's End. We'll spend the rest of the morning searching the seas of Gorda Banks seamount, a renowned gathering place for whales, especially humpbacks, dolphins, and other sea life. Following lunch, we'll set out to snorkel the pristine reefs of Cabo Pulmo National Marine Park, one of the most successful national marine parks in the world, and chat with locals about their advocacy to protect this unique place. (B,L,D)

DAY 6: LOS ISLOTES AND LA PAZ

Awake this morning off the rocky island of Los Islotes, where we'll don flippers, a mask, and snorkel (which we provide) and swim with curious sea lions. Then we'll reposition to the colorful city of La Paz to garner insight into the culture of Mexico, soak in the vibrant street art, and stroll the lively "Malecon" on a guided walking tour. Dinner will be an unforgettable

cultural experience, complete with local cuisine, dancing, and folklore. (B,L,D)

DAY 7: EXPLORING THE SEA OF CORTEZ

Our plan is flexible as we explore some of the Sea's many uninhabited islands. Our Captain and Expedition Leader will choose the perfect combination of activities for the day. We may go ashore at Isla San Francisco, where a sweeping arc of white sand beach beckons you to kayak or stand-up paddleboard. Or, hike to the nearby ridge for unparalleled views over Isla Danzante with your naturalist. You may also visit the abandoned salt works on Isla Carmen. You'll get a chance to see the great diversity offered in the Sea of Cortez, and with some luck, spot the amazing wildlife. (B,L,D)

DAY 8: LORETO/DISEMBARK

Disembark in Loreto after breakfast and transfer to the city center. Here you can choose to visit the first mission in Baja California, as well as the nearby museum to learn more about what makes this town so special. Enjoy free time to explore the quaint shops and vibrant side streets. After lunch, transfer to Loreto Airport for flights home. (B,L)

DAY 1: LORETO/SAN CARLOS/ DISEMBARK

Upon arrival in Loreto, transfer to San Carlos and embark the National Geographic Venture. (D)

DAY 2: BAHÍA MAGDALENA

Explore the ever-shifting sand dunes of Isla Magdalena, on a cross-island walk to one of the most pristine beaches in the Pacific. Bird watching here can be excellent—magnificent frigatebirds, pelicans, cormorants, terns, great blue herons, ibis, whimbrels, and willets are among the species we might see. It's not unusual to see forty species of birds in just one day along these fertile shorelines where they refuel for their destinations ahead. (B,L,D)



DAY 3 AND 4: LAGUNA SAN IGNACIO Laguna San Ignacio is a large bay and favored haunt of the gray whales in Baja. The ship will anchor at the mouth of this remote and important locale, while we observe the mother and calf pairs in our Zodiacs and local pangas. For some reason, the whales here seem to be friendlier than they are elsewhere. It's not unusual for mothers and calves to approach our boats, the calves often playing hide and seek—sometimes even welcoming a touch or a friendly chin scratch. (B,L,D)

DAY 5: AT SEA

As we travel south along the Pacific coast of the peninsula, there is a chance of seeing a wide variety of marine life, including the largest animal on Earth, the blue whale. (B,L,D)

DAYS 6-14: ISLANDS OF THE SEA OF CORTEZ

Cruise past the spectacular Friars Rocks at Land's End. For those who wish, we will arrange



a visit to the historic town center of San José del Cabo, Isla San Pedro Mártir, Los Islotes, Isla San Francisco—these are some of the melodious names of islands scattered throughout this beautiful sea. After over 20 years of exploration here, we are still discovering new places and experiencing exciting events: bow-riding bottlenose dolphins, or sperm whales near our ship; a pod of fin whales feeding around a convergence zone. The best areas for whale watching remain consistent—the waters south of Isla Carmen, Canal de Ballenas up north, and near the mouth of Bahía Concepción. Whether on the bridge of the ship, on Zodiacs, or kayaks, we will be in prime position to observe them all. (B,L,D)

DAY 15: LORETO/DISEMBARK

Disembark in Loreto after breakfast and transfer to the city center. You'll have the opportunity to visit the first mission in Baja California, as well as the nearby museum to learn more about what makes this town so special. Enjoy free time to explore quaint shops and vibrant side streets. After lunch, transfer to Loreto Airport for flights home. (B,L)

Walk up a desert wash to search for desert birds and the endemic pinto chuckwalla—a plump, harmless desert lizard. Later visit Isla San Pedro Mártir, a 1,000-foot-high guano-covered island that is home to thousands of seabirds: brown pelicans, magnificent frigatebirds, Brandt's cormorants, and California sea lions.

ISLA SAN MARCOS:

At Isla San Marcos, there is a beautiful shoreline for swimming, snorkeling, and kayaking. In the afternoon, we are again in rich whale waters, near the mouth of Bahía Concepción, where we have excellent possibilities of sighting several species of whales, including fin or sperm.



One of the larger islands in the Sea of Cortez, San José, offers several landing possibilities depending on conditions and the whim of the moment. Photograph the ochre cliffs of the island's eastern shore, hike an "enchanted" *arroyo*, or visit the abandoned salt works to the west.

BAHÍA LORETO MARINE PARK:

This morning we'll search for whales in the waters south of Isla Carmen, an area that has proven to be one of the best for finding blue whales, and often, bottlenose and common dolphins. In the afternoon we visit one of the islands of Bahía Loreto Marine Park, with ample time for kayaking, snorkeling, stand-up paddleboarding, and possibly, hiking. In the evening, enjoy a beach barbecue under the desert sky.



ISLAS LOS ISLOTES AND SAN FRANCISCO:

At Los Islotes, don flippers, a mask and snorkel (which we'll gladly provide) and swim with curious sea lions. We have a leisurely afternoon to swim, kayak, or hike at Isla San José. Endemic yellow-footed gulls, brown pelicans, and blue-footed boobies are all part of the landscape. Finish the day with a relaxing beach barbecue complete with a bonfire and a star-filled sky.

APR. 20: LORETO/DISEMBARK

Disembark in Loreto after breakfast and transfer to the city center. Here you'll have the opportunity to visit the first mission in Baja California, the Loreto Mission, as well as the nearby museum to learn more about what makes this town so special. Enjoy some free time to explore the quaint shops and vibrant side streets. After lunch, transfer to Loreto Airport for flights home. (B,L)



DAY 1: LORETO/SAN CARLOS/EMBARK Upon arrival in Loreto, transfer to San Carlos and embark *National Geographic Sea Lion*. Tonight we'll anchor off the coast of Isla Santa Margarita. (D)

DAY 2: BAHÍA ALMEJAS/REHUSA CHANNEL/ISLA MAGDALENA

Awake in Bahía Almejas, the southernmost part of the Bay. We'll make a special stop to view a large frigatebird colony on Isla Santa Margarita before heading out on our first whale watching trip of the voyage. The whales in Bahía Almejas tend to be very active, seemingly oblivious to our presence. As we explore this bay and the Rehusa Channel via local panga, our team will do whatever it takes to provide you with memorable and meaningful experiences. During lunch, we'll sail toward Isla Magdalena to explore the ever-shifting sand dunes on a cross-island walk to one of the most pristine beaches in the Pacific. Take a dip or tally the treasure found on what we affectionately call "sand dollar beach." (B,L,D)

DAY 3: TRANSIT THE HULL CANAL/ BOCA DE SOLEDAD

Spend the morning transiting the scenic winding Hull Canal. Within its narrow channels, bordered by mangroves and sand dunes, and filled with abundant wildlife, we'll hang out on deck with our keen-eyed naturalists to spot species and hear expert commentary. Weather




