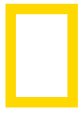

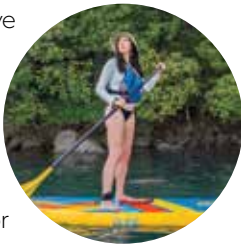

NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC QUEST

The 50-cabin *National Geographic Quest* was purpose-built for immersive exploration in the tropical wilds of Central America and Colombia. Exceptionally nimble, she can anchor off tiny islets, slip into secluded bays for private snorkeling excursions and trace the winding jungle waterways of the Panama Canal Zone.

National Geographic Quest is stocked with a fleet of kayaks, stand-up paddleboards and Zodiacs so that we can discover these wild places in-depth, without being dependent on ports or piers. A full suite of underwater exploration tools—including high-definition cameras and video microscopes—reveals the vibrant marine life that teems below the surface of these turquoise seas.

Sleek and modern, the ship offers elevators, private balconies in select cabins and expansive open decks and floor-to-ceiling windows that keep you immersed in the region's lush tropical landscapes. The lounge hosts the Daily Recap, where our naturalists bring your expedition discoveries to life. And at any time, guests are welcome on the open Bridge, where they can observe our skilled crew navigate the hidden channels and coastal inlets that make these voyages so extraordinary.

THE PANAMA CANAL

A STORIED CROSSING BETWEEN TWO OCEANS

More than a century after its completion, the Panama Canal stands as a critical achievement in commercial and engineering history. Transiting this storied passageway aboard the *National Geographic Quest* means learning about a modern wonder from the inside out—and gaining in-depth perspectives on its economic, mechanical and political impact from the experts who sail alongside us.

Overnighting in the Panama Canal Zone allows guests the unique opportunity to take in eye-level views of the locks' intricate workings by day, and to witness the spectacle of the canal's dazzling illumination after dark. Just beyond the gates of this engineering marvel, we experience a dramatic change in scenery. The concrete walls of the canal stand in sharp contrast to the surrounding leafy jungles, where flora and fauna have thrived thanks to preservation efforts aimed at sustaining the health of this vital ecological corridor.

Step ashore at Barro Colorado Island to learn about the lush lowland tropical forests that have drawn biologists from across the globe to the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute for nearly a century. Or, walk along the elevated boardwalks of the Panama Rainforest Discovery Center trail, through a canopy that harbors a rainbow of some 400 bird species.

UNCOMMON ADVENTURES IN CENTRAL AMERICA AND COLOMBIA

Spend Time at a Renowned Research Station

Since 1932, scientists from across the globe have traveled to Panama's Barro Colorado Island to conduct tropical ecology research. Walk the island's lush lowland forests with a locally based naturalist for an in-depth look at this dynamic ecosystem.

Encounter Rare Wonders of the Tropical Dry Forest

The Guanacaste region of Costa Rica is home to one of Central America's largest tropical dry forests, a rare ecosystem of delicate scrublands and flowering trees. Search for species like armadillos and white-nosed coatis that are uniquely adapted to the arid conditions.



Delve Into the Pearl Trade

After the Spanish first plucked the archipelago's namesake gemstones from bordering waters in the early 16th century, the Pearl Islands became a harvesting hub. Hear about the history surrounding the pearl trade as we explore the colonial past of these idyllic islands.



Enjoy an Immersive Village Visit

Spend a day in Panama's Guna Yala archipelago, where Indigenous Guna women make intricate *mola* handicrafts just as they have for centuries—a tradition incorporated into colorful appliqué clothing that is still worn on the islands today.



Seek Out Elusive Jungle Wildlife

Venture through the tangled tropical forests in or around Corcovado National Park, described by *National Geographic* magazine as "the most biologically intense place on Earth," and seek out rare and reclusive creatures, from grazing tapirs to tree-climbing anteaters.

Expedition cruising is a great fit for families, whether you are parents traveling with grade-schoolers or grandparents bringing along the whole crew for a graduation celebration. What age groups would enjoy expedition cruising?

What types of activities can children participate in?

Any of our expert-led excursions, from zip-lining to snorkeling with colorful fish.

Families often reserve adjacent rooms that turn two cabins into a family suite.





What can kids do on the ship?

Kids tend to love downtime on board: they are free to roam and explore their interests, but never far from family. They can examine footage of sea creatures with an undersea specialist or visit the open Bridge to see the captain demonstrate how navigation instruments work. They might read a book in the lounge, or play a board game with new friends. They have just enough independence—and plenty of ways to stay entertained.



How far ahead of time should you book an expedition cruise for your family?


We recommend booking as far out as possible so you have flexibility to reserve the cabins and dates that suit your family. Booking early also gives you plenty of time to research fun facts about your destination together and to prepare for the adventure ahead.
