|| DENMARK STRAIT

Look out for humpbacks, beluga whales and seals as well as the elusive narwhal and polar bear.



|| EAST COAST OF GREENLAND

This region offers incredible opportunities to explore multiple fjords aboard ship as well as on landings, where hiking, kayaking or Zodiac cruising might all be possible.

|| VIGUR

A pristine island sanctuary where the only resident family preserves seabird colonies and continues the centuries-old tradition of sustainably collecting and cleaning eiderdown.



|| DRANGEY ISLAND

The remnant of a 700,000-year-old volcano and a paradise for seabirds, including large colonies of guillemots, razorbills, kittiwakes and Norwegian fulmars.



|| REYKJAVÍK

The world's northernmost capital, just below the Arctic Circle, Reykjavík marks the beginning and end of our voyages in Iceland.



|| DYNJANDI

Hike along a fjord to the face of one of Iceland's most beautiful waterfalls: the tiered Dynjandi, which cascades some 330 feet across a verdant cliff face.



|| HEIMAÆY

Climb to the rim of Eldfell crater, where steam still escapes the earth after the island's 1973 eruption, and see excavated homes preserved in ash in this "Pompeii of the North."

Siglufjörður was the center of Iceland's once-thriving herring industry. Stop by the Herring Museum for a salting demonstration and a tasting.



GRÍMSEY

Cross into the Arctic Circle on this remote island, where dramatic sea cliffs provide nesting grounds for some 80,000 pairs of puffins between April and August.



HÚSAVÍK

Stay along the coast and enjoy a slower pace to the day with forest bathing, bird watching and a soak in the GeoSea bath.



BORGARFJÖRÐUR ESTRYI

Bike into the Icelandic backcountry, riding through the foothills of iconic Mount Svartfell.
