The Nile Ritz-Carlton

Situated in the heart of Cairo along the east bank of the Nile, this premier hotel is a short walk to the Egyptian Museum and ideally located for seeing Cairo's other sights. From your Nile-view room you'll look across the river to Gezira Island and the Cairo Tower and, if the weather cooperates, the Pyramids in the distance.



Four Seasons at The First Residence

On the Giza side of the Nile this splendid hotel is situated between the verdant zoological and botanical gardens and the river, and it serves as an ideal jumping-off point for exploring the famed Pyramids of Giza. We'll explore them up close in the afternoon and you may see them dramatically lit at night from your balcony.



Private Aircraft


Chartered aircraft with only our group aboard for internal flights in Egypt means we travel at ideal times and aren't at the mercy of commercial air disruptions. Practically, it means you'll have the luxury of exploring at your own pace in places like Abu Simbel, where tours are typically rushed.



Oberoi Philae

A voyage along the Nile is the centerpiece of your journey, and there are few, if any, ships that can match the elegance, ideal size, and graciousness of the *Oberoi Philae*. Originally built for 100 guests, it was completely remodeled in 2015 to accommodate just 42 in peerless style. Her 22 cabins, including 4 suites, are spacious and comfortable. Large windows offer panoramic views of life along the river. A swimming pool on the top deck is a place to relax in the sun or cool off, and an al fresco dining room lets you take in the air over lunch.











DIM LIGHTS ILLUMINATE AN ANCIENT PASSAGEWAY.

Dry dust hangs in the air. You crouch as the passage narrows and the ceiling gets lower, and then step into a vast cavern awash with colors so vivid they could have been painted yesterday. This is the Egypt you've dreamed of exploring. Most visitors to Egypt see the treasures of Tutankhamun in the museum. We enter the tomb. And the tombs of Seti I and Nefertari—sensitive sites limited to only a few visitors per day. By virtue of permits we've secured long in advance, we've been granted special access to explore these incredible places. Join us to explore Egypt as few ever do or will.

What you'll discover is stunning. Choose to soar above the Valley of Kings in a hot air balloon. Enter the Temple of Amun at Karnak on foot. To discover the epic scale of these places where for thousands of years kings built temples, shrines, obelisks, and statues is to feel antiquity come to vivid life.

Enter the tomb of Nefertari, open to only a few visitors each day, to see the vividly painted and carved walls • By special permit explore the tomb of Seti I, closed for decades and is among the finest and most colorful in Egypt • See Hatshepsut's Temple, built by the most notable female pharaoh and set dramatically against a sandstone cliff • Fly by private air to explore the two stunning temples of Abu Simbel at your leisure • Get stunning photos in normally photo-restricted areas via our special permits and the guidance of a professional photo instructor • Explore the Valley of the Kings, where some of Egypt's greatest pharaohs built tombs • See Old Cairo, including the "Hanging Church" suspended over a Roman fortress • Seamlessly add Jordan, including stunning Petra, to your expedition

PYRAMIDS OF GIZA

Ride a camel to the base of the Great Pyramids and Sphinx and follow a narrow passageway under the pyramid to the Grand Gallery and burial chamber of Cheops.



OBEROI PHILAE

CAPACITY: 42 guests in 22 cabins including 4 suites. **REGISTRY:** Egypt. **OVERALL LENGTH:** 235 feet.

The *Oberoi Philae* originally began service in 1996, configured at the time with 50 cabins and with a maximum capacity of 100 guests. A multiyear renovation completed in 2015 converted her into an extraordinarily beautiful and private ship, with just 22 cabins, modern amenities, and a relaxed, elegant ambiance.

PUBLIC AREAS: There is a great deal of attractive and comfortable public space. Deck E is a perfect place to relax and watch life along the Nile. The 36-foot-long swimming pool, surrounded by lounge chairs, is among the largest of any Nile ship. Some meals are served al fresco in the covered sitting area. Deck D has a fully equipped spa with treatment rooms, and there is a selection of spa treatments and massages available (a professional masseuse is on board). There is a fitness room with cardio and weight machines. Deck C has a lounge and library, ideal for reading about Egyptian history. On Deck B you'll find the main lounge, which is the venue for talks and presentations. And Deck A has the elegant restaurant. There are three water coolers available on board for your convenience and can be used to refill personal water bottles.

MEALS: Served in single seatings, meals focus on fine Egyptian, Middle Eastern, and Continental cuisine. Refreshments are always available. Lunch is occasionally served on the Deck E, weather permitting.

CABINS: All cabins and suites are elegant and very spacious. All face outside, with large windows that are almost floor to ceiling, and which open to offer great views of the Nile. There is ample storage space. Each cabin has a 40-inch flat panel TV, DVD player, mini-fridge, safe, hair dryer, individual climate controls, and remote-control-operated blackout blinds. Laundry service is included. There is a mix of queen-bedded and twin-bedded cabins.

SPECIAL FEATURES: Her scale, décor, and renowned service defines *Oberoi Philae* as the finest ship on the Nile. She has the intimate size and appointments of a luxury yacht, with the spaciousness and gracious hospitality of a luxury hotel. Savor her private and public spaces—with complimentary wireless internet access throughout the ship.


CATEGORY 1: #B01-B06: These cabins are 388 square feet, located on Deck B and have twin beds that can be pushed together to make a queen, sliding glass windows with French balcony, and a shower.

CATEGORY 2: #C01-C10: These cabins are 388 square feet, located on Deck C and have twin beds that can be pushed together to make a queen, sliding glass windows with French balcony, and a shower.

CATEGORY 3: #D03-D04: These cabins are 388 square feet, located on Deck D and have two single beds that can be pushed together to make a queen, sliding glass windows with a French balcony, and a shower.

CATEGORY 4: #D01-D02: These luxury suites are 580 square feet, located on Deck D and have a king bed, sliding glass windows with French balcony, separate living area, shower, and a stand-alone tub.

CATEGORY 5: #D05-D06: These luxury suites are 580 square feet with a 323 square feet balcony with heated outdoor whirlpool located on Deck D and have a king bed, sliding glass windows with French balcony, separate living area, shower, and a stand-alone tub.
