GO FARTHER

TOM RITCHIE is a professional naturalist and expedition leader who has worked in the field of expedition

cruising almost since its inception by Lars-Eric Lindblad. Growing up near the Everglades allowed him to spend his youth exploring the swamps, marshes, forests, and reef systems of South Florida, a perfect training ground for his life with Lindblad Expeditions-National Geographic. Since 1977, Tom has led Lindblad-National Geographic voyages to the far reaches of the globe. As a child, I loved reading my father's *National Geographic* magazines. I dreamed of visiting the exotic places described in the articles. I treasured my world globe. I would spin it, moving my finger up and down until it eventually stopped on some random land position (although I often forced it to stop on Africa) telling myself, "I will go there someday." I have made it to many of those places.

In 1988, while sailing off the coast of Western Australia near Shark Bay, I found myself at 28.5 degrees South latitude. "That's interesting," I thought, "because my home in Florida is located at 28.5 degrees North latitude." I then remembered we were exactly 12 hours ahead of Florida time and I realized that this was the absolute opposite position on Earth from where I live. If I were to leave my house and travel in any direction on a straight course, I would eventually end up right on this spot. I had reached my own antipodal opposition. One can't go farther from home than that!



But 'Go Farther' does not refer only to reaching a long distance from home. It also includes seeing and experiencing places and cultures that are very different from one's own. I have been to many remote regions in Oceania where the inhabitants still live by traditional ways that cannot be too different from how our remote ancestors survived in preindustrial times and these experiences are fascinating, thought provoking and, in certain ways, quite moving.

I learned through first-hand experience that traveling to far-flung places is one of the greatest educational experiences possible. During my long association with the Lindblad family, I have seen many of our guests 'go farther' through unexpected encounters with exotic wildlife or during joyful interactions with people whose lives and cultures are entirely different from their own. How much more understanding and tolerance would be garnered throughout the world if everyone had the opportunity to do this.

Expanding one's horizons and experiencing the world's wonders away from familiar home territory recalls the inspiring words of Henry David Thoreau, "We need the tonic of wildness..." For those of us who are inveterate travelers, the past two years have been frustrating but the wild and remote places — when we have been able to reach them have offered solace and provided joy. As Thoreau wrote, "We can never have enough of nature."



NORTH AMERICA

From sea to shining sea, North America showcases its wildness—from Newfoundland's striking fjords and Alaska's calving glaciers to flocks of pink flamingos in the Bahamas and Baja's mother and calf gray whales. Breathe the sweet, sultry perfume of the Barrier Islands' Spanish moss-draped oaks and the bracing fresh air of a British Columbia old growth rainforest. In remote, roadless places, jet boat through sinuous Hells Canyon or kayak in the still mangroves of uninhabited Conception Island where sea turtles forage and boobies nest. Follow the trails of Vikings, Christopher Columbus, and Lewis and Clark and learn about cultures like the Gullah-Geechee people of the coastal South and the Haida whose ancestors settled in Haida Gwaii nearly 13,000 years ago. North America's natural wonders are incredibly diverse, offering unmatched, mystical wild encounters with brown bears and manta rays, crashing hidden waterfalls and deep blue holes swirling with marine life.

We eliminated guest-facing single-use plastic fleet- and offices-wide, too. And we've embarked on several new initiatives. Here's what we're up to.


Glide, an eco-friendly company located in Salt Lake City, manufactures our fleet of stand-up paddleboards. Glide sources foam for their boards from across town and picks up the scraps to reuse and recycle. In addition, Glide created custom non-toxic pads for our boards. So, guests exploring via SUP can paddle secure in the knowledge they're on the most environmentally responsible SUP afloat.



Glide SUPs are made with plant-based Entropy Bio resins, sourced from the waste stream of the biodiesel fuel and paper production industries. Using no toxic, lead-containing automotive coatings, Glide's finish has the lowest negative environmental impact in SUP manufacturing.

Introducing the world's first self-disinfecting ships! Fleetwide we have deployed a revolutionary disinfection technology: Premium Purity[™], a combination of two synergetic products, ACT CleanCoat[™] and ACT ECA System[™]. Using sunlight and a proprietary catalyzing mechanism for disinfection, and water and salt for cleaning, Premium Purity[™] achieved stats impressive enough to warrant a fleet-wide roll-out:

- Reduces guest-reported illness by 50 percent
- Eliminates exposure to toxins for our cleaning staff, and potential allergens for our guests
- Reduces water usage by approximately 1.1 million gallons per year (fleet-wide)
- Removes 1,000 single-use plastic bottles from the cleaning process annually (fleet-wide)

Lindblad Expeditions is committed to buying locally wherever possible. This is good for local farmers and fishermen, and for the environment when there's less to ship by air. In 2018, 15.9 percent of our ships' provisions were purchased locally in Galápagos. In 2019, nearly 27 percent of provisions were souced locally. And, as we are in the process of starting a new relationship



with a local fish co-op, our locally purchased stats will grow. This not only supports the local economy; it helps to preserve the Galápagos eco-system by reducing the threat of invasive species entering through imported food and goods.

In conjunction with South Pole, the world's leading developer of international emission reduction projects, we developed an online



carbon calculator for guests to use if they wish to carbon offset their flights to and from our ships. Simply enter flight details, and it tallies the carbon emissions, the offset cost (often surprisingly low), and provides a choice of projects-renewable energy (solar/wind), reforestation, or community projects-to invest in to mitigate the footprint. We go to the planet's premier places to see wildlife, and often enjoy thrilling up-close encounters. However, we always maintain an appropriate distance from all animals, whether we're in the field or observing from the ship. And we withdraw at the least sign of animal discomfort. The photos shown in our brochures are taken by Lindblad Expeditions, and other photographers, including our guests, using high-end lenses that can create the illusion they are 'too near' the animal. Enjoy these stunning, up-close images, secure in the knowledge that skill and technology, not invasive closeness, produced them.




