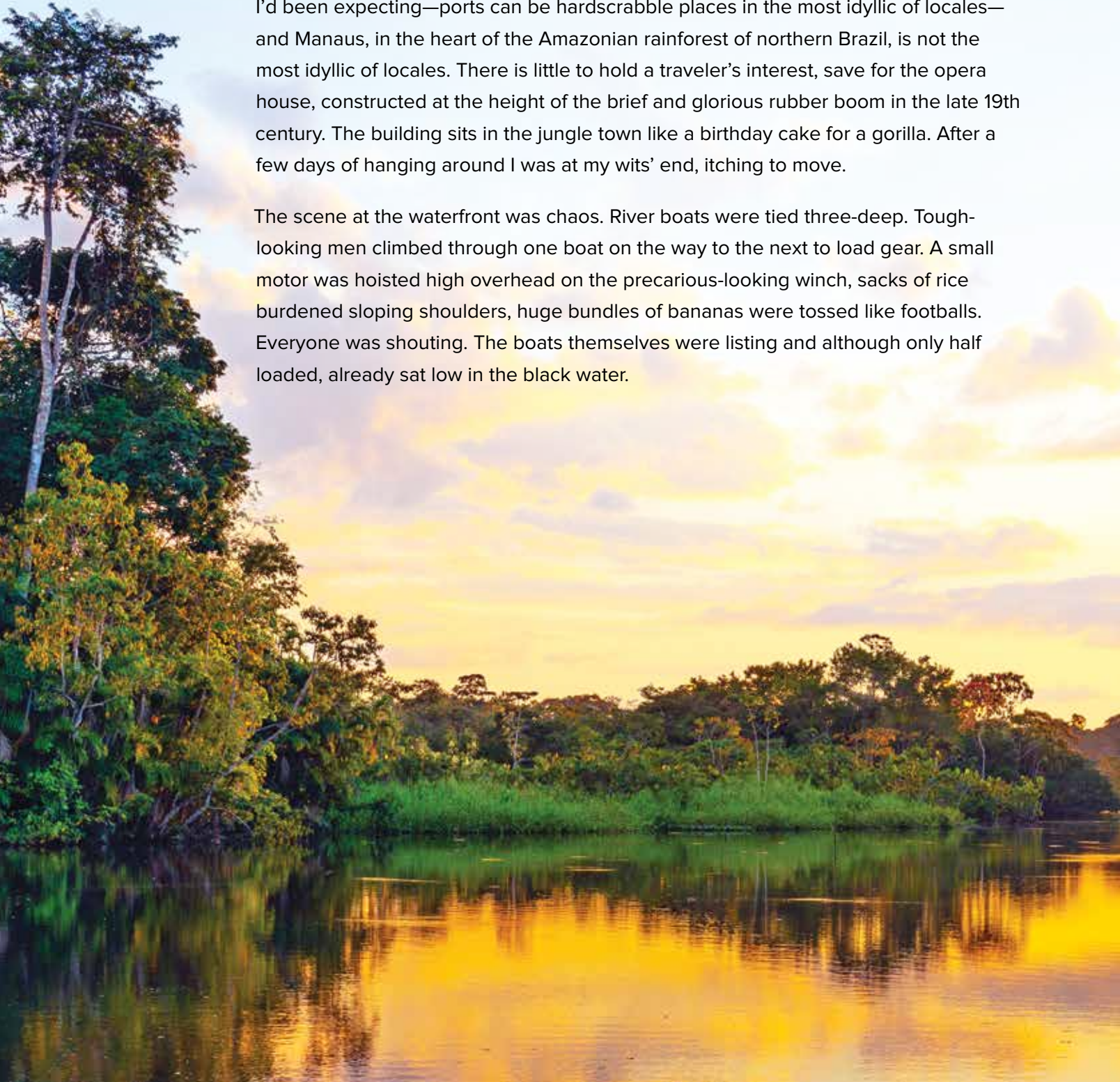


GO FARTHER

I headed down to the river. I had a notion that I might get on a boat to Belém, on the coast, three days away. When I arrived at the port my nerve left me. I don't know what I'd been expecting—ports can be hardscrabble places in the most idyllic of locales—and Manaus, in the heart of the Amazonian rainforest of northern Brazil, is not the most idyllic of locales. There is little to hold a traveler's interest, save for the opera house, constructed at the height of the brief and glorious rubber boom in the late 19th century. The building sits in the jungle town like a birthday cake for a gorilla. After a few days of hanging around I was at my wits' end, itching to move.

The scene at the waterfront was chaos. River boats were tied three-deep. Tough-looking men climbed through one boat on the way to the next to load gear. A small motor was hoisted high overhead on the precarious-looking winch, sacks of rice burdened sloping shoulders, huge bundles of bananas were tossed like footballs. Everyone was shouting. The boats themselves were listing and although only half loaded, already sat low in the black water.



On two boats people were staking out turf, slinging hammocks from the beams of the roof that protected the open air deck from the heavy Amazonian rains. “If they could do it...” I thought. But these people were of this place, this was their life, they used this transport to get to work, to return to their family. I was on a lark.

But I had set out from home in a conscious endeavor to get away from my comfort, to experience things I didn’t in my daily life, to go farther. I knew I could never do this. I turned to leave. Then I saw the small, whitewashed shed.

“Just go a little farther,” I said to myself.

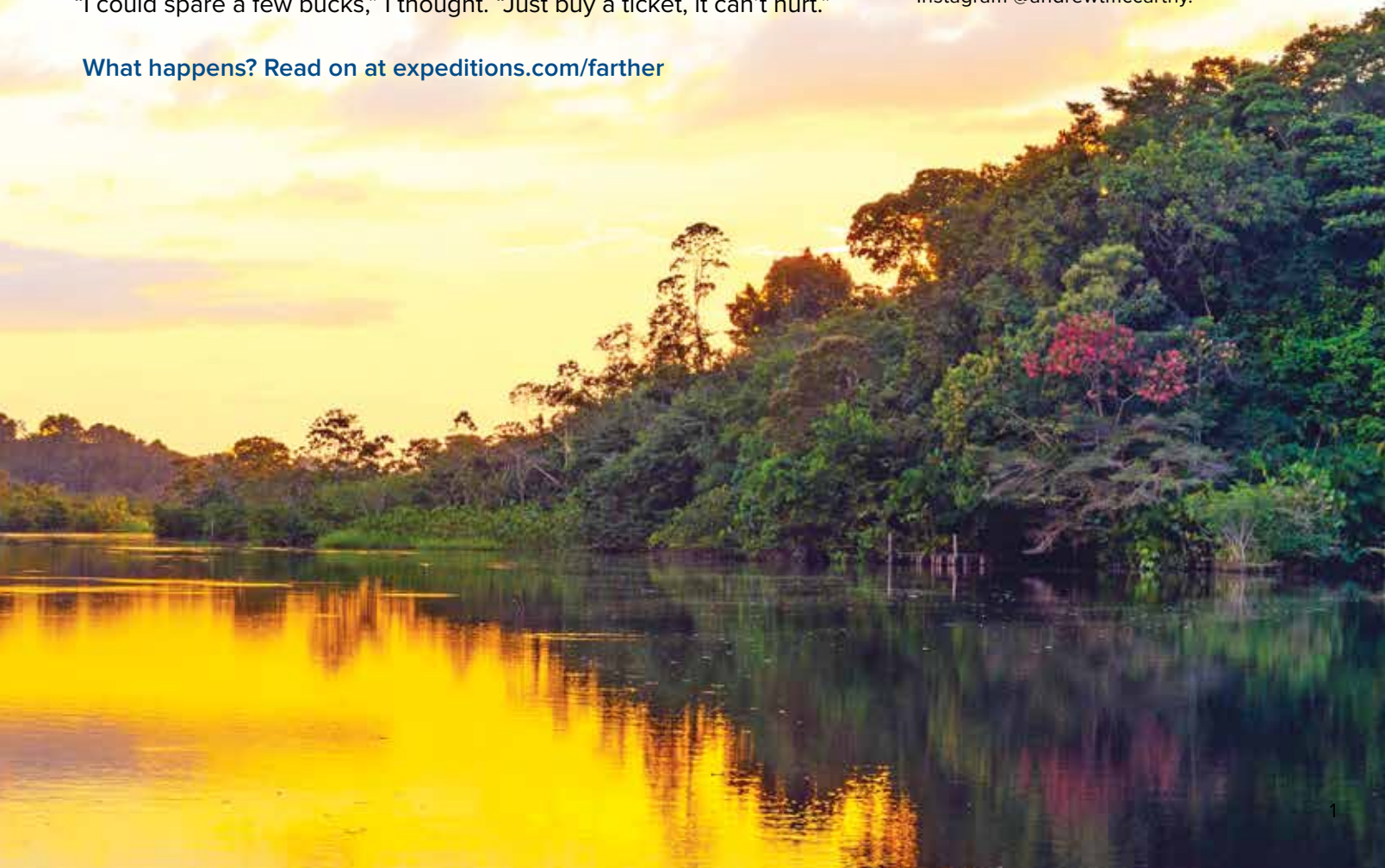
I approached the stout man behind the counter, his face was deeply creased. He told me it cost only a few *reais* for the journey down river. “I could spare a few bucks,” I thought. “Just buy a ticket, it can’t hurt.”

PLANT-FORWARD & OCEAN-CENTRIC: A NEW WAY TO CRAFT CHEESE

Aboard the ships of the Lindblad-National Geographic fleet, farm-to-table food has been a reality for some time, thanks to the innovative thinking and passion of Ana Esteves, Lindblad Expeditions' Director of Hotel Operations. In 2017, Ana started a farm-to-table program in Galápagos that bolstered local agriculture to the point where Lindblad Expeditions is now purchasing some 86 tons of fresh produce per year. And thanks to Ana's leadership, other travel companies operating in Galápagos are following suit, measurably benefiting the islands' economy. We are one of the only expedition companies provisioning fresh produce in the Southern Ocean—from hydroponic growers in the remote Falkland Islands. And Ana is cultivating farm-to-table relationships in the Arctic, Baja, Central America, and Alaska, as well.

Our galley teams have been provisioning with sustainable meats and seafood, local whenever possible in all the regions we explore, for decades now. So, it's not surprising to learn that Ana is in the vanguard again, leading a shift that mirrors a growing global trend, toward more plant-forward offerings on our ships.

"The shift toward plant-forward options, for me personally, and for the new inspiration of our menus, is being driven more by the real threat of environmental collapse, than vegan ethics, or vegan cooking,"

Ana explains. "Unlike Eleven Madison (the elite, culturally-significant, Michelin-starred Manhattan restaurant), which announced its switch to an exclusively plant-based menu; or (online recipe site) Epicurious's decision to eliminate all beef-based recipes, our menus across the fleet will continue to be diverse, to satisfy the diverse desires of our guests, while widening to include multiple plant-based options for all meals daily."

To kindle the plant-forward conversation on our expeditions, however, she's chosen a dramatic focal point: cheese. Vegan cheese, to be specific.

Cultivated onboard, nurtured in a novel *terroir* of fresh sea air, far from cows, goats, sheep, or *terra firma*, the culinary team's array of

cheeses, as the photographs featured here show, is stunning evidence of creativity, manual dexterity, and something along the lines of bio-mimicry.

Pioneered in the galley aboard the brand-new polar vessel *National Geographic Endurance*, these artisanal vegan cheese are made by sprouting and fermenting various nuts and seeds, and carefully monitoring their processes, as different seeds and nuts proceed at different rates. Almonds, for example, typically require 48 hours to transform; other nuts sprout within 6-12 hours. Artistry is involved in the blending, flavoring, shaping, and consistency-building, depending on the type of cheese. Then, each cheese is processed, aged, and stored for various intervals.

Given the success of these early efforts, vegan cheeses will soon be cultivated by all chefs of the Lindblad-National Geographic fleet, reflecting, however subtly, the unique *terroirs* of each ship and destination. Will some future guests with heightened palates be able to distinguish cheese produced on *National Geographic Orion* in Polynesia from one crafted aboard *National Geographic Explorer* in the Chilean Fjords? Possibly. However, what's certain is that tastings of these vegan cheeses will stimulate interesting conversations—as guests savor a new range of flavors, textures, and possibilities for adapting to a changing planet.

And cheese is only the beginning of Ana's vanguard approach to fine expedition dining.

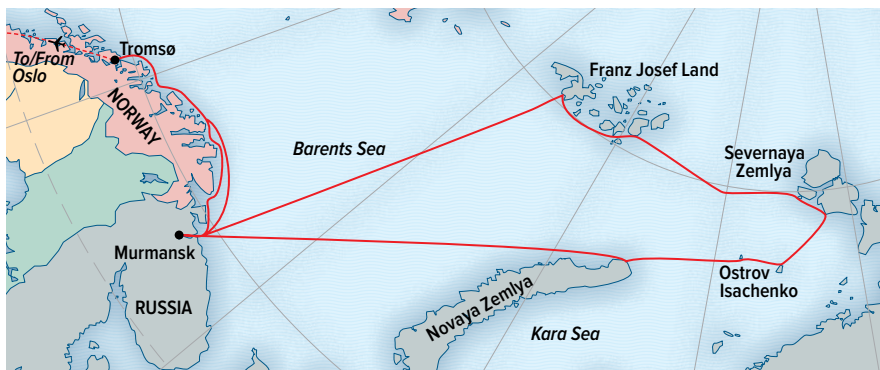

RUSSIAN FAR EAST

To explore the Bering Sea and North Pacific is to encounter fascinating little-known cultures, volcanic landscapes, and wild places barely on human radars. Well above the Arctic Circle, more polar bears give birth on Wrangel Island than anywhere else on Earth, and this island at the 180th meridian is also where the world's largest population of Pacific walrus gathers. 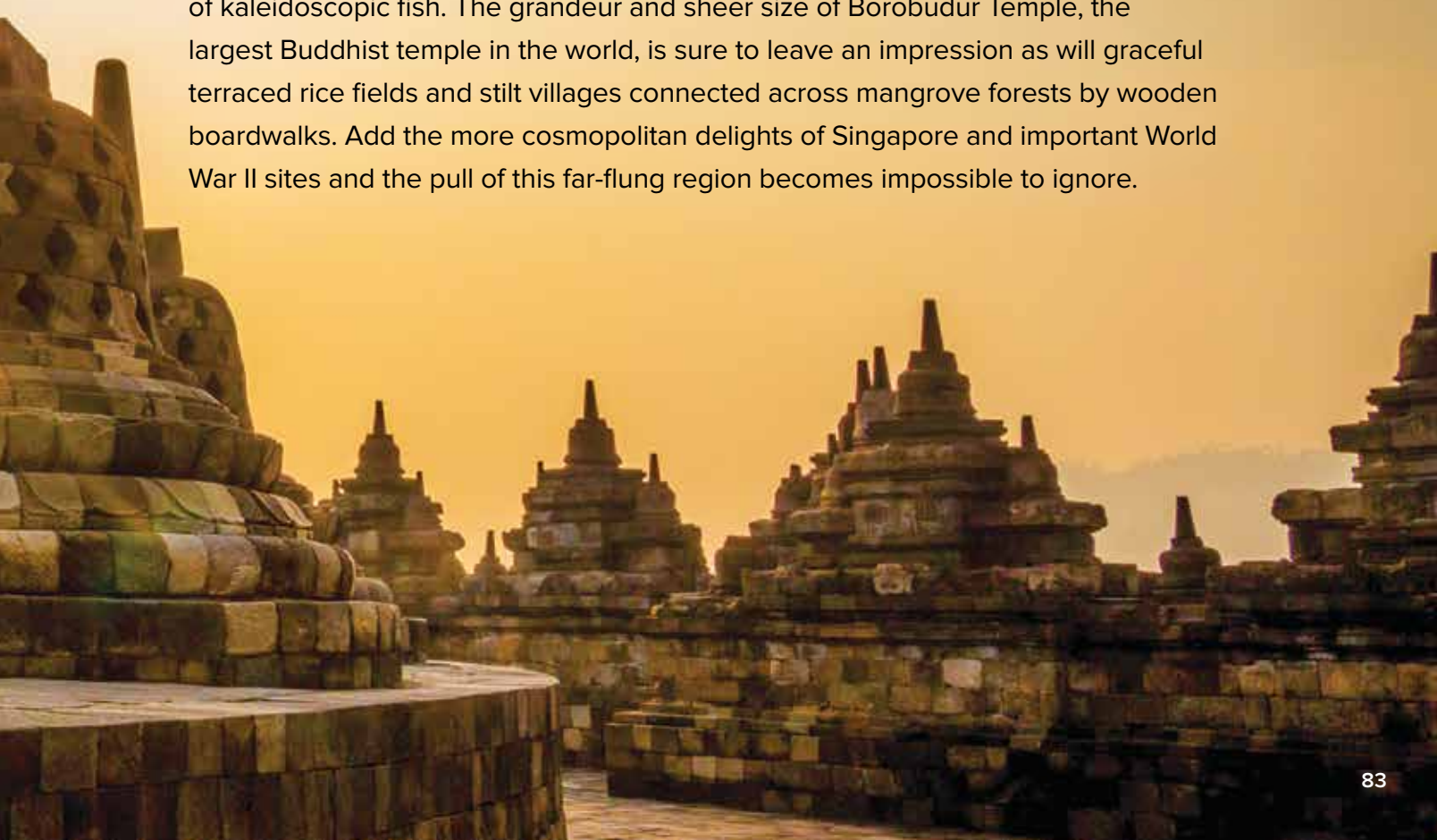

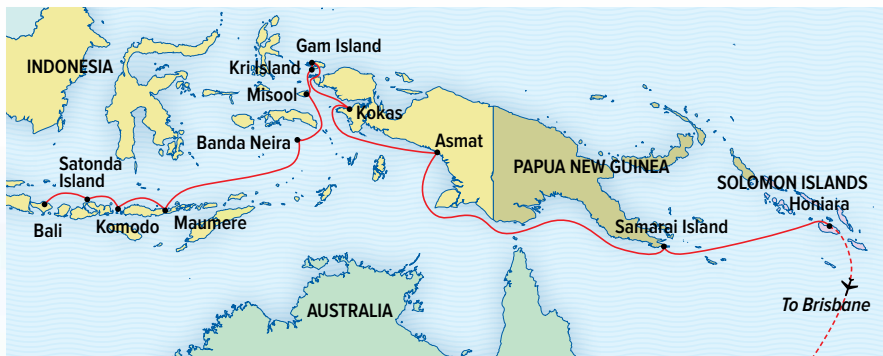

DANCES, SPIRIT HOUSES & RITES: ENDURING CULTURES OF THE PACIFIC ISLES

By Tom Ritchie



TOM RITCHIE is a professional naturalist and expedition leader who has worked with

since the pioneering days of Lars-Eric Lindblad. Growing up near the Everglades allowed him to spend his youth exploring the swamps, marshes, forests, and reef systems of South Florida, a perfect training ground.

Lindblad Expeditions-National Geographic is returning to the islands of the South Pacific. We think we are familiar with the cultural aspects of the people who live here from what we have seen on television and in films—primarily centered in just two island groups in Polynesia: the Hawaiian Islands and the Society Islands, both of which have had long associations with westerners—missionaries, whalers, traders, colonizers, and international tourists.

However, there are many other islands throughout the South Seas with which most of us are not familiar—particularly in the regions known as Melanesia and Micronesia, as well as the more remote Polynesian islands.

These islands have a mild climate throughout the year. Much of their food comes from trees that require little, if any, maintenance, and can be enjoyed throughout the year. Fish from the local waters, domesticated pigs and chickens, and a few crops, such as taro, yams, sweet potatoes, and manioc, make up additional staples. The forests supply building materials for traditional thatched house construction. Therefore, conditions afford people plenty of time for artistic and social pursuits—gathering around a bonfire on the shore, eating and drinking, telling stories, laughing, and of course, it usually includes singing and dancing.

Some of the cultural features we expect to see include the **secretive Rom dance** that is unique to **Ambryn Island, Vanuatu**, which is performed by men wearing incredible masks and elaborate full-body outfits that represent spirits. In the **Solomon Islands**, we'll learn about the **snake and turtle clans on Owaraha** and visit their **revered spirit house**. On the **Fijian island of Beqa** (pronounced em-beng' a), we will observe the **traditional firewalkers** who pad barefoot on searing boulders in a sacred fire pit. In **Wallis and Futuna**, an

island group in Polynesia, we will be welcomed with a **fierce warrior dance performance** and shown a historic "cannibal oven" that dates to the period before 19th-century Christian missionaries converted the inhabitants. On the **Micronesian island of Guam**, we will learn of the interesting **Chamorro culture**, which is a blending of Micronesian, American, European, Asian, and Spanish heritages. **Tanna Island** has an active volcano known as **Mount Yasur**, which continuously belches smoke and ejects molten rocks high into the sky. This makes for an amazing site for **rowdy and energetic dances** with wild chanting and masses of people jumping in unison with grass skirts and pounding sticks. These are just a few of the amazing cultural properties we expect to experience. And because we will be on an expedition, there will be many fascinating facets we don't expect!

PACIFIC ISLES

Volcanic peaks rise dramatically from turquoise lagoons and steep cliffs drop straight to deserted beaches. An astonishing array of marine life inhabits clear, warm water: 20 species of whales and dolphins, 16-foot manta rays, green sea turtles, and vast schools of tropical fish dart around multicolored galaxies of healthy corals. Dine on a private motu; float in a hidden cave; spot an ultramarine lorikeet on a rainforest hike or a fairy tern while kayaking in a secluded cove. Find your perfect paradise in the iconic landscapes of jagged green peaks, pristine beaches, and the bluest of blue waters, continuing the legacy of explorers, writers, and artists like James Cook, Robert Louis Stevenson, and Paul Gauguin. Idyllic surroundings are a given but what many find surprising is how much these islands are steeped in history and culture. Through meeting welcoming locals and seeing dance performances, thousand-year-old petroglyphs, an eight-foot moss-covered tiki, sacred sites called marae, and Easter Island's iconic moai, we learn about this region's proud history and cultures.

IN THE SOUTH PACIFIC, WATER IS THE MEDIUM & THE MESSAGE

'50 shades of blue.' That's the tourist board description of Polynesian's clear waters, and it's valid—extending into the furthest reaches of the Pacific. AFRICA

On an epic Indian Ocean adventure from cosmopolitan Cape Town to intriguing Zanzibar, encounter the Big Five roaming across savannah grasslands, hippos and sea turtles in a wetlands preserve, and playful lemurs in the forests of Madagascar. 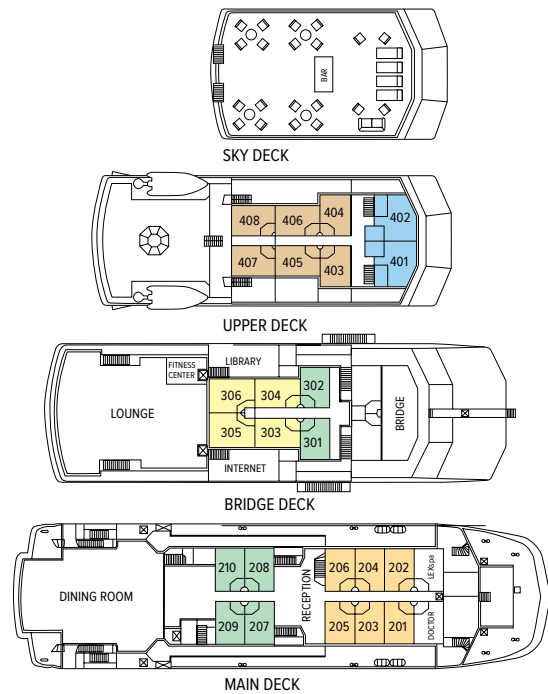

Built in 1931 by Wall Street businessman E. F. Hutton for his wife, Marjorie Merriweather Post, *Sea Cloud* carries 30 sails measuring a total of 32,000 square feet.

PUBLIC AREAS: The covered Lido Bar is a superb place to congregate and enjoy the outdoors. The open-air "Blue Lagoon" is a wonderful place to relax. There is a sumptuous lounge and guests are welcome on the "open Bridge" to learn how *Sea Cloud* is navigated and sailed.

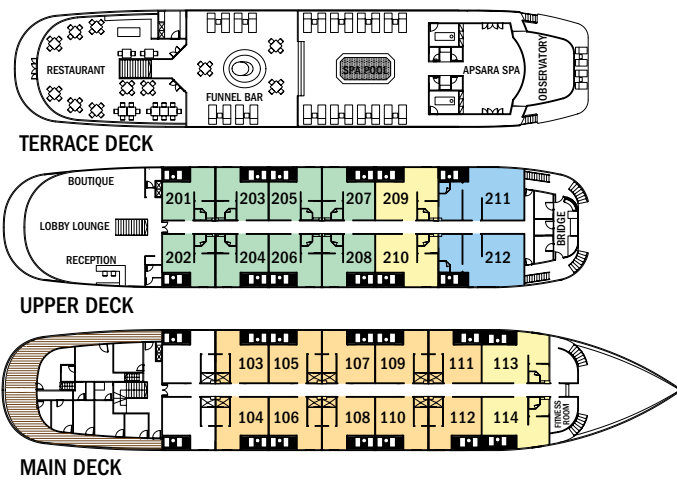

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
