And we are thrilled to be going back to New Zealand, on two different, equally appealing itineraries. One of the three legs of the Polynesia triangle (Hawaii and Easter Island being the other two), New Zealand offers an incomparable blend of Maori culture, wildlife and stunning landscapes.

We are looking forward to sharing all these far-flung geographies, united by the bold exploits of the great early Polynesian explorers, with guests eager to get out into the world again. And our two ships the 102-guest *National Geographic Orion* and our brand new 126-guest *National Geographic Resolution* are the perfect platforms for exploring the Pacific, and for enjoying the indoor-outdoor life the sublime climate makes possible.

A region lost to time and enveloped in lore, the remote archipelagos we explore are true paradises both on earth and below the surface of their translucent waters. This biologically rich region is known as the global center of marine biodiversity, with more than 500 species of corals and nearly 2,000 species of fish and is a mecca for snorkelers and scuba divers. Above sea level, the region is equally fascinating, from the giant monitor lizards of Komodo Island, the ancient spires of 9th century Borobudur Temple, and the intricate ikat textile weavings of Watublapi. Heartily welcomed by friendly villagers, we learn about life in places where locals don't use paper currency. To quote Sven Lindblad, "these areas are about as exotic as it gets from an historical, cultural, and biological perspective."
