

FOR MANY TRAVELERS, THE DESIRE TO VISIT PATAGONIA WAS SPARKED by reading Bruce Chatwin. Published in 1977, his *In Patagonia* was hailed as a masterpiece, revolutionizing the travel genre and making its author famous overnight. It certainly provided our expedition teams with lasting inspiration. We have explored Patagonia often over the decades. Now, our newest sister ships, *National Geographic Endurance* and *National Geographic Resolution*, will sail the coasts of Patagonia during their inaugural seasons.

There are many reasons to explore Patagonia, and numerous hurdles to doing so. In Chatwin's time and long after, backpacking and car or bus travel were the only real means to cover great distances. Despite the recent surge of interest in Patagonia and an increase in air travel, getting from Point A to Point B has not improved dramatically, since many Patagonia flights route back up to Santiago and Buenos Aires before connecting back down to Patagonia.

Our three expeditions featured here provide ideal solutions. Not only will you be able to easily and enjoyably traverse great Patagonian distances to experience the astounding diversity, you will also enjoy access to places and opportunities you'd otherwise miss—in the company of our expert team, who will do whatever it takes to ensure you the consummate Patagonia experience.

ISLA DE LOS ESTADOS, ALSO KNOWN AS STATEN ISLAND, HAS been so seldom seen that it holds a near-mythic place in the region's collective consciousness. In 2015, ours was the first outside expedition ship granted the privilege to travel here since it was essentially closed off to tourism decades ago. Since 2012, members of our expedition staff have worked with authorities to develop guidelines for responsible tourism. Now, you can enjoy an island of exceptional interest with extraordinary wildlife. Blue-eyed shags nesting in the tussock grass. Magellanic penguins heading down to the sea to feed. South American fur seals basking on the rocky shoreline, and in the crystal clear waters, South American sea lions swirling through the beautiful kelp beds.

We are proud to have helped to pave the way for sustainable eco-tourism to the island. All of our voyages call at Staten Island, so no matter which you choose, you'll have the unique opportunity to discover it. Hike through the last stands of forest before the Andes disappear into the Atlantic Ocean, to a knoll overlooking the placid bay where 'the lighthouse at the end of the world' stands, the inspiration for Jules Verne's adventure novel of the same name. (Perhaps you'll join fellow guests reading it on location!) See the evidence of natural forces that impressed Verne. And experience the moving sense of being in sovereign nature.

OUR BRAND NEW SHIPS *NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC ENDURANCE* AND *National Geographic Resolution* are both equipped for exploring a region that boasts scenic fjords, monumental glaciers, granite spires, rolling pampas, forests, a beckoning island—and little infrastructure of docks or piers. We'll revel in our remoteness, using the ships' fleet of Zodiacs to land on a Staten Island beach. Or deploying the fleet of kayaks to experience the calm beauties of a Chilean fjord. The onboard ROV, guided by our undersea specialist, might discover something even few scientists have seen. And when we're at sea heading to a new destination, each ship is designed to keep you connected to the stunning scenery outside—with expansive decks, acres of glass windows, a warm and welcoming Bridge, plus an observation lounge, library and main lounge conducive to seeing all there is to see and do, including informative talks and presentations. Each ship's galley team is dedicated to keeping your appetite for adventure kindled and sated. And the onboard amenities contrast nicely with the vagaries of Patagonia weather. Cossetting cabins and suites, with our signature feather duvets, offer the perfect ending to active expedition days.

GATEWAYS TO WILDNESS


Puerto Natales is one of Patagonia's southern gateways. Check into The Singular Hotel Patagonia. Tour the town and dine at the hotel.

ICONIC PARKLANDS

Explore Torres del Paine National Park by hiking, horseback riding, sailing among icebergs to the foot of the immense Grey Glacier, visiting the Salto Grande waterfall, and seeing the towers of the central massif from the Blue Lagoon. Look for guanacos, rheas, and condors.

STUNNING FJORDS

Myriad fjords or *senos* indent the coast. Cruise deep into the *senos*, punctuated at the end by tidewater glaciers. We'll look to make stops in the extensive maze of channels and islands of the Chilean fjords, where we may go out to explore by Zodiac and kayak or take a forest walk.

RARE ACCESS

Tierra del Fuego is one of Patagonia's crown jewels. We have special permission from the Wildlife Conservation Society to visit Karukinka Natural Park, home to nesting black-browed albatross, condors, and elephant seals.

SAILOR FEAT

Sail Cape Horn, the southernmost tip of the continent and, weather permitting, land there for panoramic views.

MYTHIC WILDNESS

Off limits for decades, now we have special access. On our pioneering 2015 expedition, we discovered mountainous, forested landscapes and rugged fjords rich with wildlife. Spot southern rockhopper and Magellanic penguins, fur seals, and sea lions. See the San Juan de Salvamento "lighthouse at the end of the world," which inspired Jules Verne's novel by the same name.





LONG BEFORE HUMANS ARRIVED ON THE CONTINENT, GLACIERS carved the landscapes of Southern Patagonia and the Chilean fjords. Now aboard the brand-new ultimate polar ship *National Geographic Endurance*, small enough to navigate the Kirke Narrows, and the perfect viewing platform, Patagonia becomes the set of the grandest nature adventures as you cruise where myriad *senos* (fjords) cut between soaring granite walls and cascading waterfalls. “Glacier Alley,” part of the UNESCO-designated Cape Horn Biosphere, contains multitudes. Explore secluded Seno Pia and its impressive glacier; dramatic Seno Garibaldi with the stunning wall of ice that is Garibaldi Glacier; and Seno Agostini, the source of glaciers originating at more than 6,600 feet in elevation. 

National Geographic Endurance and *National Geographic Resolution* are next-generation expedition ships, purpose-built for polar navigation. Fully stabilized, highly strengthened, ice-class Polar Code PC5 (Category A) vessels, they are designed to navigate polar passages year-round, and safely explore uncharted waters, while providing exceptional comfort. The patented X-bow® is key to their design; its powerful wave-slicing action provides an extremely smooth ride even in adverse conditions, and even reduces spray on deck for superior observation. They carry a full suite of expedition tools, and offer a variety of experience enhancing amenities.

PUBLIC AREAS: Two restaurants, a chef's table for small group dining, observation lounge with bar, gym, wellness area, infinity-style outdoor hot tubs, library, main lounge with full service bar, 24-hour beverage, state-of-the-art facilities for films, slideshows and presentations, and a photo workshop area; plus, an expedition base with lockers for expedition gear, and an "open Bridge" for access to our Captain, officers and the art of navigation.

MEALS: Two restaurants, featuring local, sustainable choices and unassigned seating for flexible, inclusive dining; plus a Chef's table for intimate, small group dining. Main restaurant has 270° views, and the Observation deck restaurant features lighter, made-to-order fare.

CABINS: All cabins face outside with large windows, private

facilities and climate controls. 53 cabins have balconies. Cabins are equipped with expedition command centers with tablets and USB/mobile device docking, TVs, Wi-Fi connections, and hair dryers.

EXPEDITION TOOLS: Zodiac landing craft, kayaks, snowshoes, cross-country skis, undersea specialist operating a remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV) and underwater video camera for unique access to polar marine world, hydrophone, aerial remote-controlled camera and video microscope.

SPECIAL FEATURES: A full-time doctor, undersea specialist, National Geographic photographer, Lindblad-National Geographic certified photo instructor and video chronicler, an internet cafe and laundry.

WELLNESS: The vessel is staffed by our wellness specialists and features a glass-enclosed yoga studio, gym, treatment rooms and spa relax area, and high and low-heat saunas with ocean views.

SELF-DISINFECTING SHIPS: Lindblad Expeditions became the first self-disinfecting fleet with the rollout of the ACT CleanCoat™ system in 2019. This photocatalytic cleaning process activates when illuminated, continuously breaking down unwanted microbes such as bacteria, viruses, mold, and airborne allergens. The positive environmental impacts of this non-toxic, chemical-free system are many: less plastic in the supply chain and waste stream, and more than one million gallons of water saved annually. The system lowers our carbon footprint and creates a cleaner, healthier shipboard environment for guests and crew alike.



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
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
