Our ships in the Pacific Northwest are nimble enough to tie up at the small docks along the river; and they're outfitted with Zodiacs to access locations along Canadian coastal waterways untouched by tourist infrastructure. We have been exploring here for decades, and our fleet of four ideally sized ships will convey you to beautiful places where larger ships simply cannot go.

Intimately scaled, with open bows and decks for unobstructed wildlife viewing, they are the perfect platforms for off-the-beaten-path experiences. All four vessels are equipped with a roster of exploration tools that make expedition travel so rewarding. A fleet of kayaks and paddleboards enable you to get out on personal water-level adventures, and splash cams, underwater video cameras, and video microscopes give you a glimpse beneath the water's surface in the Salish Sea.

On our *Columbia & Snake Rivers* voyage, enjoy a farm-to-table lunch in Walla Walla on spring departures, or in the golden Hood River Valley in the fall, and welcome a vintner or brewer aboard for a sampling in the ship's lounge. Overlying it all: the intrepid spirit of Lewis and Clark and the Corps of Discovery. As you travel in their wake, your historian will weave tales of this dramatic episode in American history.

**FALL'S BOUNTY.** Harvest time along the Columbia and Snake Rivers bursts with flavors—and in our own dining room as we provision the ship from local markets and wineries. Photo ops abound with dark green hillsides interrupted by reds, golds, and greens as the leaves change.

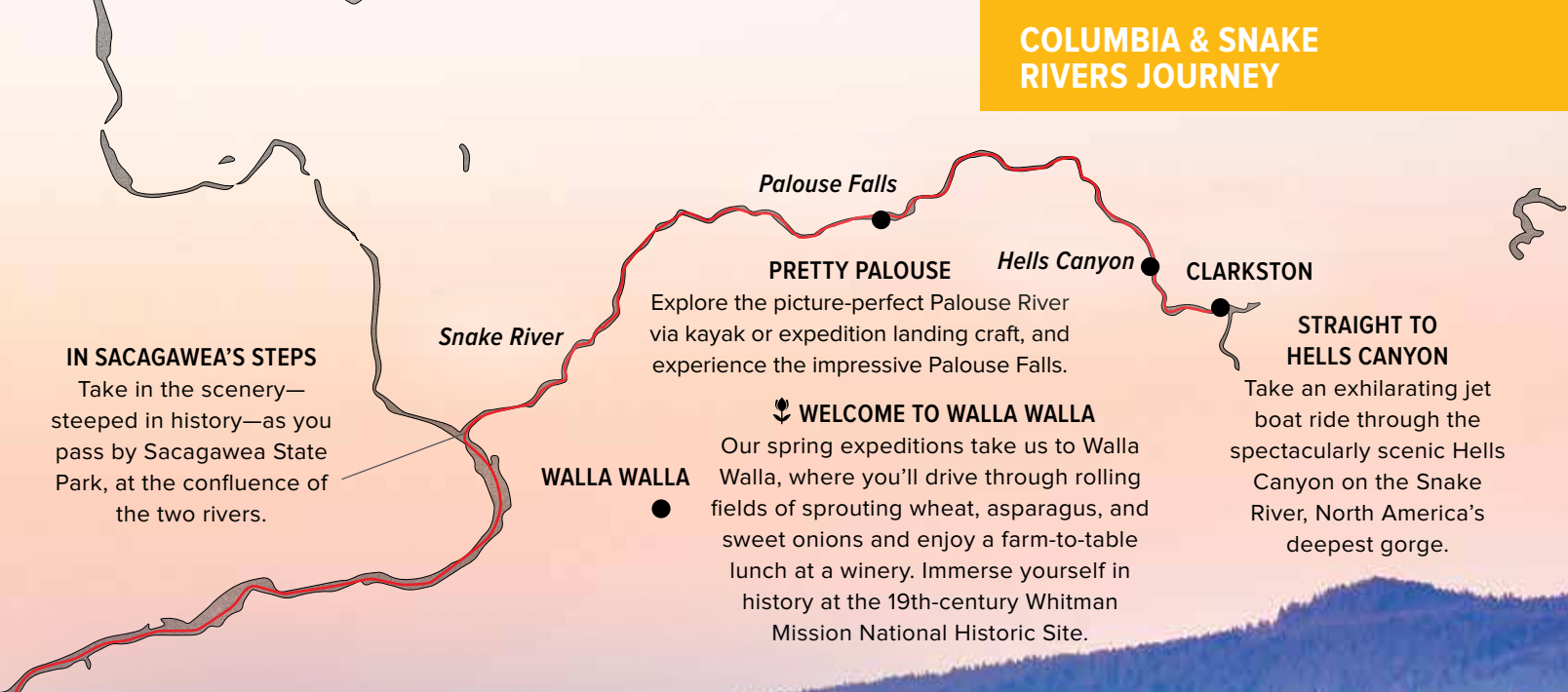

**MYTH, BEAUTY, AND LIVING TRADITIONS.**

On Cormorant Island in British Columbia, Alert Bay is a village in traditional Kwakwaka'wakw territory. The rich history of this thriving First Nations' center of art and tradition is symbolized by a 173-foot high totem pole, one of the tallest in the world, and the U'mista Cultural Centre. We'll feel history in the drumbeats at a moving,

private dance performance in the Big House at the Centre. This afternoon pick your spot at the deck rail and have your binoculars at the ready as we search for wildlife, including, with luck, killer whales.

**INSIDER'S TOUR OF VICTORIA.** Victoria is a city of neighborhoods, and you'll be able to experience them with all your senses—on an active bike tour, or a leisurely historic stroll, or a tour of two of the city's world renowned gardens. Enjoy a private reception at the Bateman Foundation Gallery of Nature while taking in an incredible collection of paintings.
