DEAR TRAVELER,

What imagination is not swept away by the romance and exploration of a river, winding around bend after curious bend? Nothing entwines our sense of mystery and exploration with comfortable observation and tranquility like a voyage on a river. Clearly, it appeals since many of the world's great rivers today are crowded with large river-cruisers, vying to dock at overwhelmed riverbank towns.

Our three voyages—on the Amazon, Mekong, and Nile rivers—are worlds apart, yet all are a complete immersion in the authentic life, nature, and hydrology of three of our planet's greatest rivers, experienced from very comfortable and beautifully appointed ships, in areas that are otherwise either difficult to access by land, as is the case in the Amazon, or even more rewarding than a land-only sojourn, as you'll discover in Vietnam and Cambodia, and in Egypt.

Viewing the river and riverbanks from the stable platform of the quietly meandering *Delfin II* or *Jahan* and then boarding smaller skiffs for more intimate exploration of tributaries, eddies, landfalls, and villages, totally immerses you in a riparian world where everything depends in one way or another on the river's temperament. And seeing how little life has changed along the Nile from the luxurious deck of the *Oberoi Philae*, prepares you perfectly to experience Egypt's timeless treasures. Personally, I love the river sunrises and sunsets, not just for the serenity and photo ops, but because it is when all life is drawn to the river's edge and the river is most alive.

Both the Amazon and the Mekong river journeys are "word of mouth" expeditions: guests learn about them from other guests—effusively praised as very special voyages that they "simply must do before it's too late." And when Lindblad Expeditions decided to resume travel to Egypt after a hiatus of some 7 years, the voyage filled instantly just by guests telling other guests.

We have space available on each ship, so, I hope this invitation to join us, with your companion, on your own, or with friends or family, means our teams will soon welcome you aboard the *Delfin II*, the *Jahan* or the *Oberoi Philae*, each the finest ship on their respective rivers.



GREAT RIVERS OF THE WORLD: THE AMAZON, ME

Rivers are the heart and soul of countries and cultures, a pulsating lifeline. And no three rivers are teeming with more life than these. The awe-inspiring Amazon flows 4,000 miles from the headwaters in the Peruvian Andes to the Atlantic. The mighty Mekong wends its way through the lush lowlands of Cambodia and Vietnam, braiding two different countries and cultures into its vibrant strand. And, the legendary Nile is the lifeblood of Egypt; civilization arose from the Nile Valley around 5000 B.C.E.

Though separated by continents, these rivers are kindred in beauty, mystery and vitality. Slip into a deck chair at dusk as the *Delfin II* voyages the Upper Amazon, the most biologically diverse area on the planet, and see a panoply of feathered, finned and furred life—as well as the people who call this ancient habitat home.



Look out from your beautifully appointed cabin on *Jahan* and see the bustle of morning life along the Mekong and its tributaries: fishermen casting giant nets, children splashing as women hang colorful laundry, where homes float, and the white of a cow or an ibis punctuates a landscape of green and crimson.

Or travel far back in time aboard the *Oberoi Philae*, whose elegance, spacious cabins and incomparable views provide a sublime way to encounter the timeless scenes of life along the Nile, highway to ancient treasures.

Each of our river journeys offers the rewards of seeing what you came for—the temples of Angkor in Cambodia; elusive pink river dolphins on the Amazon; Luxor and the Pyramids of Giza via the Nile—and far more. Trust each with your sense of awe and wonder, and they will deliver genuine discovery, beauty, and insight.

RIVER TRIPS THAT GO IN-DEPTH WHILE

Distinctions abound between our Amazon, Mekong, and Nile voyages, but they share key commonalities that make exploring these mighty rivers with us an investment in meaning and magic.

EXTRAORDINARY SHIPS

The *Delfin II* on the Upper Amazon, the *Jahan* on the Mekong, and the *Oberoi Philae* on the Nile are the loveliest ships on their rivers, with furnishings and amenities that reward body, mind, and spirit—and reflect the inspiring essence of the regions they represent.





SUPERB DINING

The cuisine aboard *Jahan* is an outstanding blend of Vietnamese, Cambodian, and Western, with choices and accommodations for vegan or other special diet requests. Dining on the *Delfin II* reflects the extraordinary cultural diversity of Peru and its flavorful fusion cuisine, featuring sustainably sourced, mostly local ingredients from the Upper Amazon. And aboard the *Oberoi Philae*, the elegant dining room features a four-course menu largely continental in style, with an occasional buffet, and some local favorites, to add variety and another window on the region to your enjoyment.

KEEPING YOU IN COMFORT

RENOWNED STAFF & REGIONAL EXPERTISE

Our river ships, like our ocean-going vessels, are staffed by veteran expedition leaders, photo instructors, naturalists or cultural experts. In the Upper Amazon, our guides are river-raised, keen at spotting and explaining behaviors of elusive jungle creatures. On the Mekong, where ancient monuments and local cultures are the focus, our guides are experts in the spiritual and historic significance of all we'll see. In Egypt, our Egyptologists have been working with us for decades, and are specialists in Egyptian culture, art, history, and archaeology.



MAKING A DIFFERENCE



The Lindblad-National Geographic Fund—with donations from our guests—supports conservation, education, research, storytelling, and technology projects in the regions we explore. In the Amazon, our grantee is Minga Peru, a nonprofit working to improve the lives of *ribereños* (river people) through education in income-generating projects like agroforestry, fish ponds, and sustainable management of natural resources. In the Cambodian village of Kampong Tralach, local

leaders received funding to build a community library providing English-language instruction to children and adults free of charge. With support from LEX-NG guests and expedition staff, the library employs local teachers and enables villagers to engage directly with travelers. This helps draw more tourists to the region, creating economic opportunities for the village, among other goals.

Discover the rain forest's wild pulse. Hear it in the noisy silence of bird calls at dusk. Feel it in the shroud of fog across the morning river. See it in the creaks and crashes of its cathedral canopy of green. And then enter the jungle and discover the all-five-senses experience of exploring here.

EXPLORE THE PLANET'S MOST DIVERSE RAINFOREST



Get ready to actively explore. You'll head out on one or more outings each day, in a group lead by a naturalist who's guided by your interests and those of your fellow guests, not following a pre-packaged tour. Board the *Delfin II*'s three skiffs, guided by

drivers who are agile navigators and eagle-eyed spotters, to discover the intricate networks of the flooded forest. Perhaps you'll spot elusive pink or gray dolphins feeding, while chattering terns dive for prey they've chased to the surface. Or in the brown water tributaries, common squirrel monkeys, a yellow handed titi, or perhaps a small group of shy monk saki monkeys, plus myriad, wildly colorful bird species might make entrancing appearances. On a trail walk, you might see poison dart frogs, a tarantula, night owl monkeys high in a tree nest, or a young green anaconda in a small pool of water. Or find yourself astounded by 'house plants gone wild'—huge strangler fig, traveling palm, heliconia and other recognizable species. In addition, you'll have the opportunity to take kayaks for personal forays into the stillness of narrow tributaries in this watery wilderness.

EMPOWER LOCAL ARTISANS & COMMUNITIES

Through our partnership with innovative nonprofit Minga Peru, you have the chance to visit and support indigenous women and families who have developed a sustainable living creating beautiful handcrafts. See firsthand how Minga Peru, with the support of Lindblad-National Geographic travelers like you, has developed a network of local women leaders, known as *promotoras*, to empower their communities. Minga invites only Lindblad-National Geographic guests into these communities, giving you a highly personal opportunity to talk to these women and their families.

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THE PERFECT BASE CA

As much of the river as on it and locally built, the *Delfin II*'s iron exterior is clad in tropical hardwoods, and her interior gleams with wood floors and lacquered palm ceilings. Wood stairs floating between decks, and lazily turning ceiling fans add the right tropical notes, while the air conditioning invisibly cools and dehumidifies. The Lounge, center of our life as an expedition community, features a welcoming open bar, inviting seating. The dining room is decorated with locally crafted lanterns, hanging over an impressive central buffet table, carved from a massive tree root found floating in the river and installed before the ship's windows were—three walls of windows keep us connected to

Dining is a mirror on the region. From the rainbow of fresh squeezed juices in the morning to the chocolate placed on your pillow each night, most of the ingredients used aboard are sustainably sourced from the surrounding rain forest. And Peru's tradition of flavorful fusion cuisine ensures that each day will offer fresh palate pleasures. Watch the river go by and look for wildlife from the spacious, airy Observation Deck.

the non-stop panorama outside. The dining is superb. And the airy, supremely comfortable cabins are the perfect ending to active days. Slip into bed, well-appointed with crisp, cotton linens, and drift off as you gaze out at the starry night through the generous, river-framing window wall.

Our base for daily explorations, and to which we happily return, the *Delfin II* has a distinct advantage over any land-based camp she moves, giving you an ever-varied experience of the Amazon's multiple landscapes and wonders.

Panoramic windows bring extravagant river views inside the air-conditioned staterooms and enclosed lounge. Cool, beautiful woven rattan sofas in the lounge are perfect for relaxing and watching the riverscapes glide past in the afternoon, and ideal for cocktail-hour recaps, and lively presentations on wildlife photography, medicinal plants in the Amazon, and much more.

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FLAVORFUL FUSION CUISINE

Modern Peruvian cuisine is a fusion of flavors, a meeting of tastes from the Inca, European, Asian, and African immigrants, all with an emphasis on what is available in this geographically diverse land. As you travel along the Amazon, you experience this internationally acclaimed cuisine (the first to earn a Cultural Heritage of the Americas award) from the comfort of a welcoming dining room, crafted by local artisans. Wake up to a rainbow of fresh-squeezed juices, experience seasonal ingredients relatively unknown outside the region—like the superfood camu camu (pictured right) and the tomato-like cocona–and end your night with chocolate placed on your pillow. Take the recipes back with you, too, as you'll have the opportunity to make ceviche, Peru's national dish, and a pisco sour, its national drink.

oyage to the headwaters of the mighty Amazon in the heart of Peru's rain forest aboard the elegant riverboat *Delfin II*. Slip through an intricate network of jungle waterways in a skiff or kayak, spotting diverse birds, as well as caimans, tamarins, and sloths. Skim past massive lily pads, peer up at towering ceiba trees, and witness glorious sunsets on the still waters of the Amazon River basin.

We have conducted numerous Amazon expeditions in our history, and launched our first voyage aboard the beautiful, 28-guest *Delfin II* in

August 2010. In order to provide expedition leadership in this pristine region, we tapped our tenured expedition leaders to lead our Amazon voyages, providing our guests with the same in-depth interpretation they find on our other expeditions. Our veteran team is highly knowledgeable about this region, and trained to illuminate all the discoveries you'll make.

DAY 1: U.S./LIMA, PERU

Arrive in Lima in the late evening and transfer to our conveniently located hotel, Wyndham Costa del Sol Lima Airport Hotel.

DAY 2: LIMA/IQUITOS/NAUTA/EMBARK

After breakfast, fly to lquitos and continue overland to the riverside village of Nauta, where the *Delfin II* awaits. Settle into your cabin, and gather for a welcome dinner of fine Peruvian cuisine on board. Tonight, step out on deck to gaze at the magnificent Amazon night sky. (B,L,D)

DAYS 3-8: PACAYA-SAMIRIA NATIONAL RESERVE

Spend this week exploring the Pacaya-Samiria National Reserve, a pristine swath of jungle—stretching more than five million acres, and harboring some of the Amazon's most fascinating flora and fauna. Bordered by the Marañón and the Ucayali, these two powerful rivers converge to create the famed Amazon, which floods annually with nutrient-rich waters. The Pacaya-Samiria rivers are known locally as the Mirrored Forest for the reflections created by the glassy water.

Set out into this remarkable wilderness on daily excursions by skiff, kayak, and, when the water level permits, by foot on dry land. Skim past giant lily pads afloat on black-water lakes, and venture deep into the rain forest on narrow tributaries. Spot sloths and monkeys, including variably colored saddleback tamarins, noisy howlers, and shaggy-tailed monk saki monkeys. Watch for an astounding variety of birds, from tanagers and hummingbirds to parrots and endangered scarlet macaws. In the river, look for signs of the massive *paiche* fish, the Amazon's largest; rare pink dolphins; and the infamous piranhas.

Enjoy an opportunity to swim in a lake in the reserve's interior. Seek out *Victoria amazonica*, a giant water lily that grows in small lagoons. Go on a birdwatching hike, listening for the vocal oropendola and then look for its telltale yellow tail. Watch the sun set and listen to a cacophonous symphony of nocturnal animals calling out across the treetops. Then slip through the forest in a skiff as night falls, using a spotlight to find caimans, frogs, fishing bats and other creatures of the night.

One of the unexpected joys of traveling in the upper Amazon of Peru is the interaction we have with the local *ribereños*, the traditional people who live on the riverbanks. Visit one of the communities and see the projects that we support though a local non-profit, including a variety of handicrafts, women's health initiative and sustainable farming. (B, L, D Daily)

DAY 9: DISEMBARK/NAUTA/IQUITOS/ LIMA

Disembark in Nauta, stopping at the Amazon Rescue Center on the drive to Iquitos. Fly to Lima, where we visit Museo Larco and celebrate with a farewell dinner. Overnight at the Wyndham Costa del Sol Lima Airport Hotel. (B,L,D)

DAY 10: LIMA/U.S.

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight home. (B)







Travel through rice paddies and lotus lily farms using a traditional two-wheeled oxcart, a bouncy but exhilarating ride. Jump into a *tuk-tuk* a three-wheeled, motorized rickshaw—and zip through the countryside to visit a local temple. Wend your way through Phnom Penh's traffic on a *cyclo*, a bicycle that pulls a twoseater car, ending with a tour of the Royal Palace. And to explore tributaries too small for *Jahan* to navigate, you can board a longboat to immerse yourself in this fascinating way of life on the water.

Depart in the evening, "lose" a day crossing the international date line, and arrive in Siem Reap on Day 3. Settle into our outstanding Khmer style hotel, La Résidence d'Angkor, on the banks of the Siem Reap River.





DAY 1: US/CAIRO, EGYPT Fly overnight to Cairo, Egypt.

DAY 2: CAIRO

Arrive in Cairo and transfer to the Nile Ritz-Carlton, your home for the next two nights. Situated in the heart of the city, your room will face the Nile (with the pyramids visible in the distance, weather permitting).

DAY 3: CAIRO

Explore Old Cairo, known for its Coptic churches, including the 4th century "Hanging Church" and the Church of Abu Serga. Stroll winding streets to the 1,000-year-old Ben Ezra Synagogue. In the afternoon, tour the Egyptian Museum, home to masterpieces including the treasures of Tutankhamun, the brightly painted limestone sculptures of Prince Rahotep and Princess Nofret, and the bizarre relief of Akhenaten. This evening, we have welcome drinks and dinner at our hotel. (B,L,D)

DAY 4: LUXOR

Fly by private charter to Luxor. Visit Karnak Temple, where for 2,000 years 30 pharaohs added their own monuments and shrines. Then embark the *Oberoi Philae*, our home for the next six nights. After lunch, explore exquisite Luxor Temple, guarded by massive statues of Ramses II—a place of worship for millennia. Later visit Luxor Museum. (B,L,D)

DAY 5: LUXOR

Explore Luxor's fabled west bank, traveling through the desert to the Valley of the Kings, an area that for centuries served as the burial ground for Egypt's greatest pharaohs. Visit three tombs in the Valley including those of Tutankhamun and Seti I (which require special permits that we will obtain for you). After lunch, by special arrangement visit one of the most remarkable tombs of all: that of Nefertari, located in the Valley of the Queens. Continue to the temple of Queen Hatshepsut, set dramatically beneath sandstone cliffs. (B,L,D)

DAY 6: DENDERA/SAILING THE NILE Visit the beautifully preserved temple of Dendera with reliefs depicting the empress Cleopatra. As we set sail in the afternoon, get a glimpse into traditional Egyptian life along the banks of the Nile. (B,L,D)

DAY 7: ESNA/SAILING THE NILE/EDFU

The Temple of Khnum at Esna was one of the last temples built during the dynastic era. Its columns are striking, and many of the capitals retain their colors. Later discover Esna on foot, for a view of small-town life in Egypt. Continue sailing to Edfu Temple and see one of the bestpreserved monuments of the Ancient World: the temple of Horus, the falcon god. (B,L,D)


DAY 8: SAILING THE NILE/KOM OMBO Sail to Kom Ombo, strikingly set atop a hill overlooking the Nile. Built during the Ptolemaic era, it is unique in being dedicated to two gods—hawk-headed Haroeris and crocodileheaded Sobek. (B,L,D)

DAY 9: ASWAN

Aswan is gloriously located on the Nile: backed by hills, with granite rocks protruding from the riverbed and sailboats (called *feluccas*) plying the water. Visit the lovely island temple of Philae. Later tour the fine Nubian Museum, drink high tea at the legendary Old Cataract Hotel, and sail on a *felucca*. This evening, enjoy a Nubian cultural show onboard the *Oberoi Philae* followed by dinner. (B,L,D)

DAY 10: ABU SIMBEL/CAIRO

Take a private charter flight to Abu Simbel, where we visit the two great temples built by Ramses II. When the Nile was dammed at Aswan, the temples were disassembled and moved, block by massive block, to higher ground. Take a private flight to Cairo and transfer to the Mena House Hotel, located at the foot of the Pyramids. (B,L,D)



DAY 11: SAQQARA, PYRAMIDS, AND THE SPHINX

Begin in Saqqara with the Step Pyramid, a revolutionary design that initiated the art of



pyramid-building. Then spend the afternoon exploring the pyramids and Sphinx. Go inside the Great Pyramid and follow the narrow passageway of the Grand Gallery to the burial chamber of Cheops. See the Solar Boat, built about 2500 B.C., and have the chance to ride a camel if you wish. Tonight, return to the pyramids for the renowned Sound & Light show. (B,L)

DAY 12: CAIRO

Cairo is a treasure trove of Islamic architecture and art; explore some of its greatest monuments, including the Muhammad Ali Mosque, the elegant Ibn Tulun Mosque, and a jewel: the Gayer-Anderson Museum. Explore the Khan el Khalili bazaar, with shops selling everything from filigreed silverwork to camel saddles! This evening gather for a farewell reception and dinner at the Mena House. (B,L,D)

DAY 13: CAIRO/HOME

Transfer to the airport for flights home, or to Jordan for our extension. (B)





The Oberoi Philae originally began service in 1996, configured at the time with 50 cabins and with a maximum capacity of 100 quests. A multiyear renovation completed in 2015 converted her into an extraordinarily beautiful and private ship, with just 22 cabins, modern amenities, and a relaxed, elegant ambiance.

PUBLIC AREAS: There is a great deal of attractive and comfortable public space. Deck E is a perfect place to relax and watch life along the Nile. The 36-foot-long swimming pool, surrounded by lounge chairs, is among the largest of any Nile ship. Some meals are served al fresco in the covered sitting area. D Deck has a fully equipped spa with treatment rooms, and there is a selection of spa treatments and massages available (a professional masseuse is on board). There is a fitness room with cardio and weight machines. C Deck has lounge and library, ideal for reading about Egyptian history. On B Deck you'll find the main lounge, which is the venue for talks and presentations. And A Deck has the elegant restaurant.

MEALS: Served in single seatings, meals focus on fine Egyptian, Middle Eastern, and Continental cuisine. Refreshments are always available. Lunch is occasionally served on the E Deck, weather permitting.

CABINS: All cabins and suites are elegant and very spacious. All face outside, with large windows that are almost floor to ceiling, and which open to offer great views of the Nile. 
