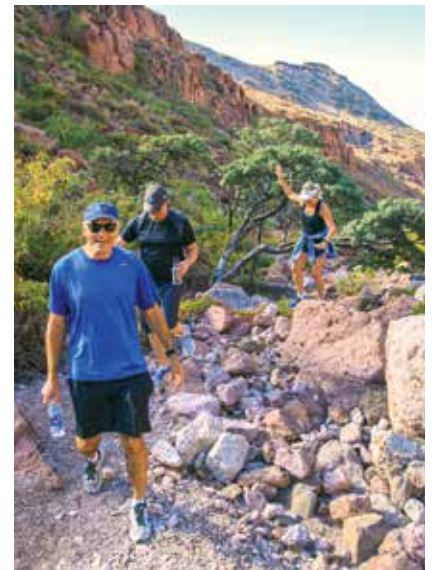
OUR SHIPS

And many are outfitted with hydrophones to listen to whales and sea lions underwater, and video microscopes for seeing plankton.

THE BLUE LAGOON & BEYOND IN ICELAND

TRAVELERS WHO DELVE DEEP INTO ICELAND, TYPICALLY FIND MUCH more than they knew or expected. 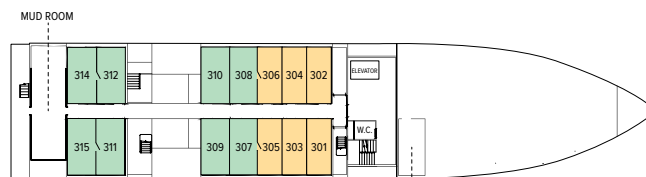

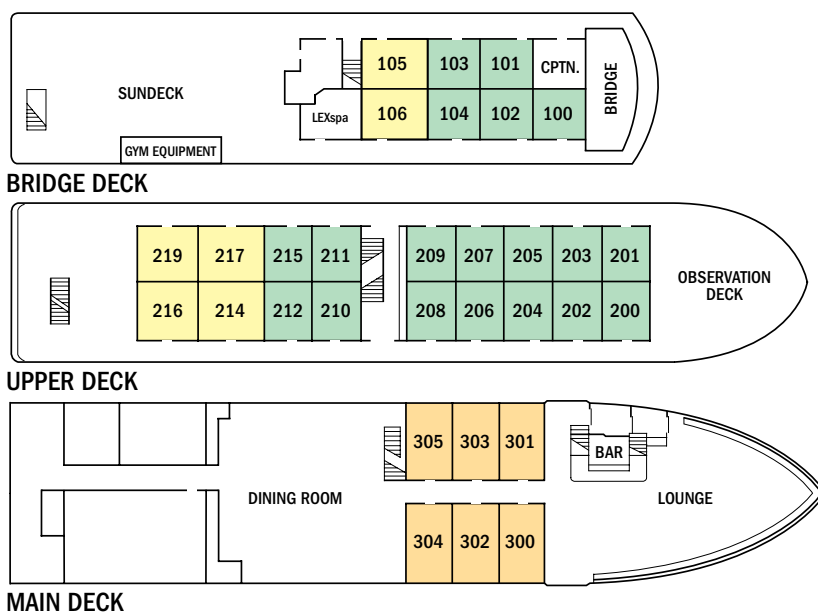
