WHY GO BY SHIP

And once in these distant, wild places, go even farther. Zodiac cruise among blue icebergs, snorkel with sea lions, or penetrate the Amazon's cathedral of green in a custom skiff. The open bows and generous windows of our ships ensure complete connection at all times to the remarkable landscapes and wildlife of the places we explore. From the deck, feel the joy of racing playful dolphins, the awe of spotting leaping mobula rays, and the unique wonder of hundreds of parrots flying overhead. And don't be surprised if your dinner conversation is interrupted by a pod of whales in a dining room surrounded by windows.

NORTH AMERICA

From sea to shining sea, North America showcases its wildness—from Newfoundland's striking fjords and Alaska's calving glaciers to flocks of pink flamingos in the Bahamas and whales and dolphins feeding among the Channel Islands. Breathe the bracing fresh air of a British Columbia old growth rainforest or witness the Earth's mantle laid bare at Gros Morne National Park. In remote, roadless places, jet boat through sinuous Hells Canyon or kayak in the still mangroves of uninhabited Conception Island where sea turtles forage and boobies nest. Follow the trails of Vikings, Christopher Columbus, and Lewis and Clark and learn about cultures like the Haida whose ancestors settled in Haida Gwaii nearly 13,000 years ago. For all our differences, one thing is certain: North America offers unmatched, mystical wild encounters with stoic bears and manta rays, crashing hidden waterfalls and deep blue holes swirling with marine life.

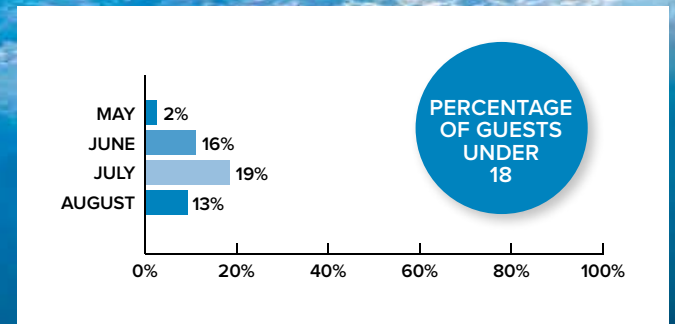

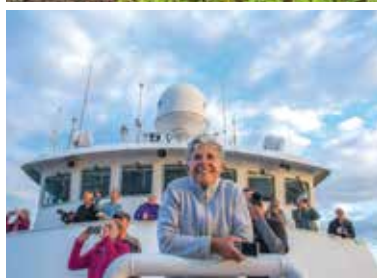

ALASKA — WHEN TO GO

No matter when you visit, the grandeur of Alaska is always on display—but different times of year hold a different kind of allure. This month-by-month guide breaks it all down.





May/June

Springtime is a favorite amongst our naturalists. Still-budding vegetation sets the stage for rarer wildlife sightings and lingering snow on the mountain peaks sends hungry bears to the shoreline to feed, sometimes with newborns in tow. Harbor seals have their pups early, and you can spot them deep in the fjords floating atop ice floes for safety. Each day bursts forth with more life, as the wildflowers bloom and days continue to stretch until the summer solstice. While nights can be a bit cooler, the days are often brilliantly sunny.

July/Early-Mid August

These months generally see the warmest temperatures and longer daylight hours means more chances to spot and observe wildlife. If a whale is spotted after dinner, we can stay on the bow until 10pm in the lingering daylight. In mid-to-late July, the salmon start running, luring bald eagles and bears. If you're inspired to forage yourself, late summer hiking trails are often dotted with a bounty of wild berries, ripe for the picking. And of course, the height of summer is prime time for families.

Late August/September

Wildlife is still very active as preparation for hibernation or migration is underway—so that means lots and lots of eating. It's "a wonderful time to predictably see large numbers of whales," according to Andy Szabo, director of the Alaska Whale Foundation. Fall in Alaska is ephemeral but brilliant, as cottonwoods turn golden yellow and fireweed turn vibrant red. Plus, September offers a chance to end an awe-inspiring day in Southeast Alaska with one of nature's most breathtaking exclamation points—the shimmering Northern Lights.

Our small ship is perfectly sized to enter and anchor in the Bay's protected waters, placing us among the friendly gray whale mothers and calves drawn to the calm nursery lagoons. Dubbed “the world’s aquarium” by Jacques Cousteau, the waters and islands of the Sea of Cortez are places of legendary biodiversity. This is an expedition of pure discovery, sailing to islands that lie in close proximity to the peninsula but have a palpable feel of rugged isolation. This geographic isolation is the major contributing factor to the long list of endemic plants and animals. And the seas, roiling with productivity, beckon whales—this is, arguably, the best time and place in the world to see a vast variety of whale species plus massive pods of dolphins, leaping Mobula rays, and seabirds.

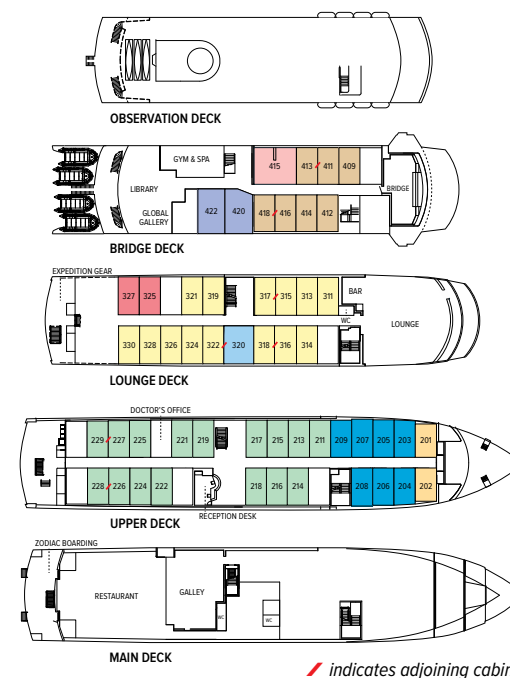

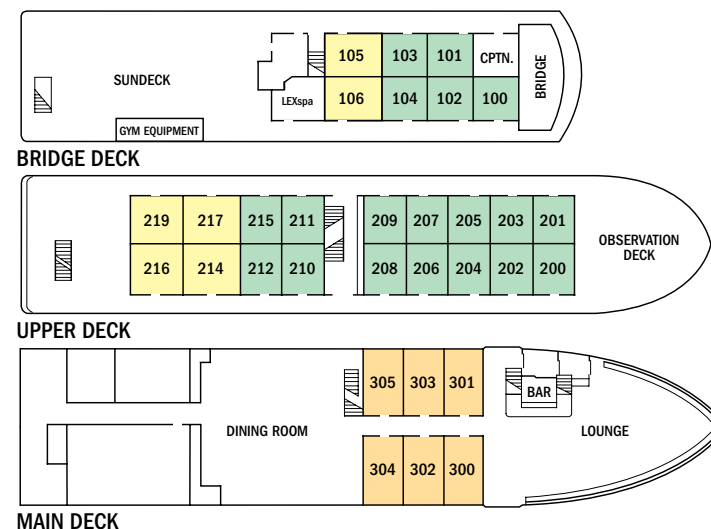

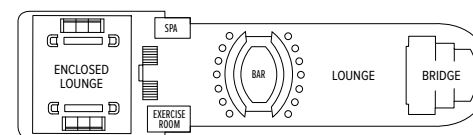

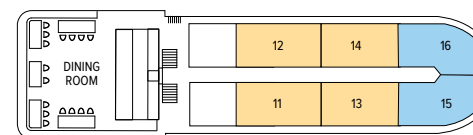

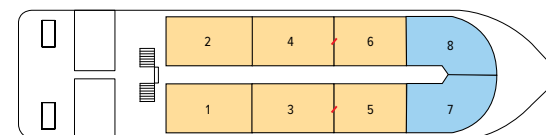
