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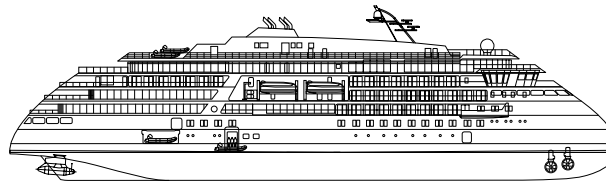
THERE'S NOTHING NEUTRAL ABOUT OUR POSITION—

Using a holistic approach and our reputable network for the research, we review every species we serve in terms of fish quotas, stock levels in particular ocean zones, method of catch, maturity levels, and feed. We are also dedicated to supporting local communities in their sustainable fishing efforts, as well as creating ocean awareness among our staff, crew, guests, suppliers, and the travel industry at large.



Our pioneering Galápagos program is rooted in our commitment to sustainability. To date, we have provisioned more than 20 tons of organic and local produce from Galápagos' farms. And not importing produce means less risk of invasive species entering the islands.



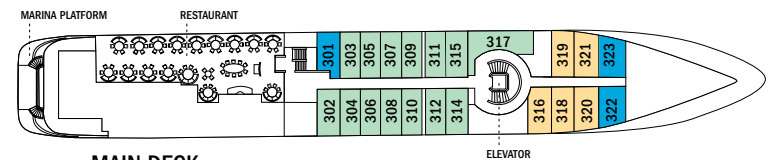
