Voyage Packing List
<input type="checkbox"/> Warm jacket.
<input type="checkbox"/> A lightweight raincoat, rain poncho, or collapsible umbrella.
<input type="checkbox"/> Gloves.
<input type="checkbox"/> Warm hat.
<input type="checkbox"/> Comfortable walking shoes with rubber soles and good support (for onboard the ship and shore excursions). Most people find tennis shoes or sneakers suitable. You may want to bring two pairs so you will have a dry pair if one should get wet. Many people find sneakers suitable, while some prefer lightweight hiking boots for additional support.
<input type="checkbox"/> Cotton slacks (khakis, jeans, corduroy).
<input type="checkbox"/> Two or three different weight sweaters (one of each).
<input type="checkbox"/> Lotions/creams for sun and wind protection.
<input type="checkbox"/> If you wear contact lenses, bring a pair of prescription glasses for occasions when lenses may be bothersome, i.e. strong winds.
<input type="checkbox"/> A small backpack or rucksack; a waterproof bag to hold your camera and/or binoculars.
<input type="checkbox"/> A good pair of binoculars.
<input type="checkbox"/> Camera, lenses, and plenty of film and/or memory cards, and extra batteries.
